Footnote 2: Recommended electives include SPC 2608, additional computer, or psychology courses.
Footnote 3: FSU requires an international/diversity course for graduation. The Chipola courses which should meet this requirement at FSU include AMH 2091/2092, ASH 1044, EDF 2085, GEA 2001/2002, REL 2300, SPT 2521, THE 1000 and SYG 1010. It is strongly recommended that one of these courses be completed before earning the AA degree.
Footnote 4: Must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Accounting Majors must complete ACG 2021 & 2071 with a "B" or better.
Footnote 5: In addition to ACG 2021 and ACG 2071, students must also complete the Accounting Competency Examination with a score of 75% or higher before they can enroll in upper-level accounting courses.
Footnote 6: If student has taken 2 credits of Foreign Language in high school then choose elective.
Footnote 7: Students enrolled in AA, AS, or BS degree programs must complete the State of Florida's Civic Literacy requirement as outlined in section 1007.25(4), Florida Statutes (F.S.). See catalog or contact an Academic Advisor for more information.
