Chipola Wins Fourth Straight State Brain Bowl Title

The Chipola Brain Bowl Blue Team won the FCSAA State Championship for the fourth year in a row, defeating Northwest Florida State College 845-225 in the championship March 19.

The tournament was played at the College of Central Florida in Ocala with a field of the top 10 community college teams in Florida: Seminole State College, Broward Blue, Valencia Red, Pasco-Hernando, Florida State College at Jacksonville, Chipola Gold, Broward White, Northwest Florida State College, and Valencia Black.

Chipola Blue finished round robin play with a 9-0 record, which set up the championship game with Northwest Florida State College. The Chipola Blue team consisted of: Dallin Kelson, Travis Bontrager, Alton Stone and Nick Ratzlaff.

The Chipola Gold team finished the tournament tied for fourth with a 5-4 record. Chipola Gold consisted of: Brittany Stephens, Annemarie Nichols, Harrison Fuqua, Zach Gilmore and Ashley Adams. Dallin Kelson won the Dave Ehlert High Point Award, averaging nearly 150 points per game, the highest in tournament history.

Chipola coach Stan Young won the Roger Raeppe Coach of the Year for the state of Florida. Young, said, "My fellow coach Dr. Robert Dunkle and I thank you all for your continued support of our program."

The Chipola Brain Bowl team will play in the National Academic Quiz Tournament's (NAQT) Intercollegiate Championship Tournament, April 9, in Chicago. The ICT is the premier quiz bowl tournament at the collegiate level and its titles are coveted by hundreds of schools



and thousands of players throughout North America and the United Kingdom. Chipola was invited to the ICT after winning the 2011 NAQT Community College Championship Tournament in February, the first national title in school history.

Members of the Brain Bowl team were honored at a reception hosted by the college Student Government Association on April 5. The team recently won the FCCAA State Tournament and the NAQT National Community College Tournament. Two Chipola teams will play against the top college and university teams in the NAQT Division II National Tournament, April 9, in Chicago.

Coach Johnson celebrates 500 wins

Chipola College baseball coach Jeff Johnson celebrated his 500th career win at a pre-game ceremony on March 23.

In 15 seasons as head coach, Johnson has built Chipola into one of the premier programs in the country. The Indians have won the Conference Championship six of the last ten years, and finished in second place several times.

Johnson was named NJCAA Coach of the year in 2007 when he led the Indians to a National Championship. He won the state title in 2007 and 2008. He has coached three JUCO All-Americans—Matt Grooms, Tyler Flowers and Mat Gamel.

Coach Johnson has helped more than 148 of his players move



on to four year universities and professional baseball. Twenty-six of his former players are in professional ranks today, including 2010 MLB Homerun Leader Jose Bautista of the Toronto Blue Jays and Yankees catcher Russell Martin.

As a high school player, Johnson was an All-State selection in baseball, football, and basketball. He set state and national high school records with 43 career interceptions as a defensive back.

Johnson played college baseball at Gulf Coast and the University of Central Florida where he set the school's career saves

record.

Johnson coached at Marianna High and Liberty County High where he led his teams to the state finals. Coach Johnson and his wife Nancy have a 13 year-old daughter Shelbie.

Chipola baseball leading Panhandle Conference race

The Chipola baseball team hosts Gulf Coast, Friday, April 8, at 2 p.m., and Monday, April 11, at 5 p.m. The Indians play at Gulf Coast April 9.

The Indians are ranked fifth in the FCSAA State Poll. Chipola is 9-3 in the Panhandle Conference play and 26-14 overall. Northwest Florida is 10-4. Pensacola is 6-8. Tallahassee is 5-9 and Gulf Coast is 4-10.

Chipola hosts Northwest on Friday, April 15, at 2 p.m. The Indians play at Northwest April 13 and April 16.

Chipola swept Pensacola in a recent three-game series. The

Indians beat Pensacola 10-3 on April 1 behind the pitching of Robby Coles. Chipola slipped by Pensacola 4-3 on March 31. Luke Bole was the winning pitcher. Chipola scored an 18-14 win over Pensacola on March 28.

The Indians swept Tallahassee in a three-game set. Chipola beat Tallahassee 6-2 on March 26. The Indians whipped Tallahassee 11-6 on March 25 with Luke Bole picking up the win for Chipola. Chipola beat Tallahassee 4-3 March 23. Matt Marsh earned the win for Chipola. Derick Pitts had 2 RBI for the Indians.

Lady Indians headed to state tourney

The Chipola Lady Indians (43-10) host Tallahassee, Wednesday, April 13, at 4 and 6 p.m., in the final home games of the season. Chipola travels to Northwest on Saturday, April 16.

Chipola has earned a berth in the FCSAA State Tournament, beginning April 29 in Pensacola.

The Lady Indians are 10-2 in league play and are tied for second in the FCSAA State Softball poll with Northwest Florida. Top-ranked Indian River leads the poll. Gulf Coast is fifth and Tallahassee is eighth.

Chipola infielder and designated hitter Ariell Van Hook was named the NJCAA Softball Player of the Week for the week of March 23. Van Hook hit .593 over eight games with 16 hits and 27 at-bats, including four doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI's. She hit a solo homerun in the 6th to tie the game against Pensacola on March 17 and drove in the winning run in the bottom of the 6th against Gulf Coast on March 19.

The Lady Indians scored a pair of wins over Gulf Coast—6-4 and 9-6—on April 5. Chipola shut out Pensacola in a double-header on April 2. Brittany Black was the winning pitcher in Chipola's 8-0 win in game one. Elizabeth Krauser earned the win in Chipola's 9-0 rout in game two. Andrea Sullivan had a homerun for Chipola in game two.

Chipola split a double-header with Northwest on March 31. Chipola scored a 7-2 in game one behind winning pitcher Brittany Black. Northwest won the second game 10-5 in 10 innings.

The Lady Indians swept Tallahassee on March 24. Brittany Black picked up the 6-1 win in the first game. Chipola scored a 2-1 win in game two. Elizabeth Krauser earned the win. Pinch hitter Brittany hit a two-run homer with 2 outs in the top of the seventh.
