Two former Chipola players picked for MLB All Star Game

Former Chipola baseball players Jose Bautista and Patrick Corbin will represent both leagues in Major League Baseball's All Star Game set for Tuesday, July 16, at Citi Field in New York.

Jose Bautista of the Toronto Blue Jays is slated as an outfield starter for the American League along with rookie phenom Mike Trout of the Angels and top vote-getter Adam Jones of manager Buck Showalter's Orioles. Showalter also is a Chipola alumnus.

In the 2010 season, Bautista became the 26th member of the 50 home run club. He led the major leagues in home runs in 2010 and 2011. He has won two Hank Aaron Awards and two Silver Slugger Awards. This will be Bautista's fourth appearance in the MLB All-Star Game.

Bautista was a member on Chipola Baseball squad before being drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 20th round of the 2000 draft. His official signing came in May 2001, the same year the Indians captured the Panhandle Conference Championship and was the NJCAA Region VIII Runner-up. During his time in the majors, Bautista has also played for the Pirates, the Orioles and the Royals.

Diamondbacks pitcher Patrick Corbin is among 13 pitchers selected for the National League team. Corbin led Chipola to a second place in the NJCAA Region VIII tournament.

The Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim drafted Corbin in the second round of the 2009 MLB Draft. The Angels traded Corbin to the Diamondbacks in 2010 as part of a package for Dan Haren. Corbin made his MLB debut with the Diamondbacks on April 30, 2012. As of July 9, Corbin is 10-1 on the season with a 2.40 ERA.

Bautista and Corbin both played under Chipola coach Jeff Johnson who recently completed his 17th season at the helm of the Indians' program. He has led Chipola to the state tournament 14 times including a third place finish in 2013 and seven appearances in the title game. Chipola won the state title in 2011, 2008 and 2007 and captured the school's first-ever national title in 2007. The Indians finished second in the state tournament in 2009, 2005, 2002 and 2001, third in 2013 and 1998, and among the top four in 2006.

Chipola students should apply now for financial aid

Students planning to enroll in Fall classes at Chipola are encouraged to apply for financial aid as soon as possible.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application should be completed no later than July 17. All required documents must be received in the Chipola College Financial Aid Office by July 24 in order to use Federal Finan-

cial Aid to cover Fall tuition and fees.

Dr. Jayne Roberts, vice president of Student Affairs, says, "Students should be sure to provide a correct mailing address and to check email accounts assigned by the college. Those who miss the deadline will be required to pay tuition and fees up front, but may be reimbursed once financial aid

is awarded."

Chipola is no longer participating in the Federal Direct Loan Programs which include Federal Direct Subsidized, Federal Direct Unsubsidized and Federal Direct Plus Loans.

Chipola to offer law enforcement and corrections classes

The Chipola Criminal Justice Training Center will offer an evening Law Enforcement Academy and a Corrections to Law Enforcement Cross-over class beginning Aug 1. Qualification deadline for all materials is July 22.

The program will meet weeknights from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. The course is 770 clock hours in length.

Chipola also offers an ongoing Basic Corrections

academy with open enrollment. Students may start within a week of qualification. Classes are weekdays, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Candidates must be at least 19 years of age and earn a passing score on the Criminal Justice Basic Abilities Test (CJBAT). Applicants must have a standard high school diploma or its equivalent and must undergo a medical physical examination, background check

and drug screening. Financial assistance is available based upon need and eligibility.

The Criminal Justice Basic Abilities Test (CJBAT) is offered at the Public Service Building on Chipola Campus every Tuesday at 12:30. Cost of the test is \$45.
