Chipola Brain Bowl wins fifth straight Delta Burke tourney

The Chipola College Brain Bowl Team finished the fall season winning the Delta Burke in Orlando for the fifth year in a row.

Paul Kelson, playing solo as Chipola Blue, finished the tournament 12-0. Along the way, he set the team points per game record, the points per bonus record, and the individual scoring record for the tournament. Kelson averaged 153.64 points per game, besting his older brother Dallin Kelson's record of 153.46 points per game set two years ago. According to Chipola Brain Bowl coach Stan Young, "Kelson achieved a rare feat in the tournament, answering all 20 questions in one round. The opposing coach asked for a picture with Kelson, which he granted."

Chipola White also had a strong tournament, finishing tied for second with Valencia Red and Valencia Black. The team of Katelyn Miller, William Singleton, and Wesley Chevillot finished 9-2, losing only to Paul Kelson and Valencia Black. Chipola's third team, Gold, finished the tournament 5-6, but won

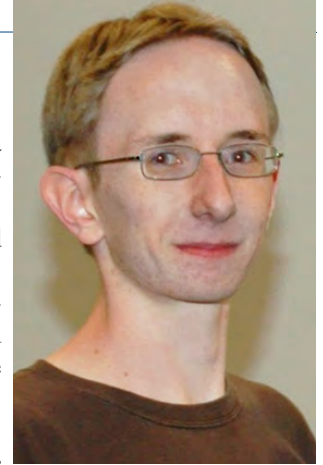
both games in the playoffs. Chipola Gold team members are: Jamie McCoy, Bobby Gause, and Faith Tice.

Three Chipola players finished in the top 15 in individual scoring. Paul Kelson led all players as tournament MVP. Katelyn Miller finished fourth overall, and Bobby Gause finished twelfth.

Chipola is off for the holidays, but will return home to host the Florida Sectionals on Jan. 25, 2013.

First Generation Scholarship funds available at Chipola College

The Chipola College Foundation is accepting applications for the First Generation in College Scholarship for the Spring 2013 semester. There will be five partial \$1,000 scholarships awarded.

Completed applications must be received in the Foundation office by 4 p.m. on Dec. 6.

Students must have applied for Federal Pell Grant (FAFSA) and have been determined to be Pell eligible in order to apply for the First Generation in College

Scholarship. Applicants must have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) below 5273 and still have unmet financial need.

The First Generation in College Scholarship is a need based scholarship to Florida residents. The student must enroll as an undergraduate, degree-seeking student for a minimum of six hours per term in a community college in Florida. The student must meet the eligibility requirements for demonstrated financial need and must come from a family where neither parent

has completed a baccalaureate degree. If the student regularly resides with only one parent who provides support, that one parent must not have completed a baccalaureate degree for the student to be eligible.

In order to apply for a First Generation in College Scholarship students must complete an application available in the Foundation office and turn it in with all of the required items outlined on the application by Dec. 6.

Chipola women’s basketball at home Tuesday

The Chipola **Lady Indians** host Miami-Dade, Tuesday, Nov. 20, at 5 p.m. in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center. The Lady Indians are fourth in the FCSAA state poll.

The Lady Indians improved to 5-0 with a three-game sweep in the Collegiate Basketball Report Classic, Nov. 8-10. Chipola scored a 59-44 win over Roxbury; a 62-58 win over Santa Fe, and trounced Monroe, 69-40.

Chipola logged a 68-60 win over Georgia Perimeter on Nov. 3 and crushed Central Florida, 88-37, in the season opener, Nov. 2.

The Indians host the men’s Panhandle Classic, Nov. 30 and Dec. 1.

The lineup for the Classic includes: Friday, Nov. 30, noon, Gulf Coast vs. State College of FL; 2 p.m., Pensacola vs. Brunswick; 4 p.m., Tallahassee vs. Queens City Prep; 6 p.m. NW Florida vs. Clinton; and 8 p.m., Chipola vs. Santa Fe.

The Indians are 4-0 as of Nov. 15. Chipola is second in the FCSAA men’s state poll and fifth in the NJCAA national poll.

ACE offers academic assistance for students

The semester’s end is nearing, bringing unit exams and finals. Chipola’s Academic Center for Excellence (ACE) provides free academic assistance to all Chipola students.

The ACE staff understands the educational backgrounds of local students and is prepared to provide the academic assistance to help students reach their educational goals. ACE offers on-demand assistance in nearly any course offered at Chipola, from Introduction to Biology to Anatomy and Physiology, Elementary Algebra to Calculus, and many in between.

ACE is staffed with administrative staff and 16 peer-tutors who have excelled in the courses in which they tutor. Tutors lead study sessions. In addition to student

staff, Chipola faculty work closely with the scheduling office hours in ACE. The ACE also has the Social Science film series and the English department’s “Crime Stoppers Writing Hotline,” seminars.

Alicia Hatcher, Coordinator of Extended Learning and Professional Development and ACE, coordinates special group sessions in ACE. “The ACE’s ability to adapt to the needs of Chipola students is exceptional. Students provide the staff with different challenges and adventures each semester, and the staff does a remarkable job of meeting the needs presented.”

As the fall semester comes to an end, the ACE will offer extended hours and additional study sessions for unit exams and finals. Visit the ACE, located in Bldg L.
