Chipola’s Continuing Education department has partnered with ed2go to offer two online ACT/SAT prep courses.

Part I, the first prep course, focuses on the verbal sections of the standardized tests: reading, English, science, and writing. Part II, the second prep course, focuses on the math sections of the standardized tests and includes lessons in arithmetic, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, and basic statistics. The cost of each six-week course is \$120.

The courses are designed to prepare participants for question types on both the ACT and SAT and will give pointers in time management, anxiety relief, scoring, and general standardized test-taking. Weekly assignments encourage participants to work with classmates and instructor to maximize performance on all aspects of the ACT and SAT.

Students learn at STEM meeting

More than 150 high school students attended the second FloridaLearns STEM Scholars Regional Forum at Chipola College Friday, Oct. 25. Students conducted lab experiments and physics activities, and learned from two area doctors.

Steven Spence, M.D., and Susan Compton, M.D., made presentations to the students about the renal system. Dr. Spence and Dr. Compton are both graduates of Marianna High School. Spence is a family physician with Internal Medical Associates in Marianna. Dr. Compton is a nephrologist with Nephrology Associates in Panama City.

Chipola professors and high school faculty led students in STEM activities. Some students participated in an investigative challenge on the renal system. Others participated in a design challenge in which they constructed and launched water rockets.

The event was organized by the FloridaLearns STEM Scholars Project, a collaborative effort of the Panhandle Area Educational Consortium (PAEC) targeting gifted and talented students in grades 9-12. The initiative is part of a multi-million dollar grant awarded to the consortia for the development of an enriched and rigorous STEM education campaign to reach students attending Florida's rural schools.

Chipola to host girls Report Classic

The Chipola Lady Indians open the season Nov. 7 when they host the three-day Collegiate Girls Basketball Report Classic.

Last season, the Lady Indians finished second in the Florida/Region VIII Basketball Tournament and went on to finish in the Elite 8 in the NJCAA National Tournament.

Girls Report Classic games begin Thursday, Nov. 7, with games at 5 p.m., Gulf Coast vs. Darton; and 8 p.m., Chipola vs. East Florida State.

Friday, games include: 10 a.m., Tallahassee vs. Darton; noon, Santa Fe vs. Northwest Florida State; 2 p.m., Georgia Perimeter vs. Broward; 4 p.m., Pensacola vs. Georgia Highlands; 6 p.m., Gulf Coast vs. East Florida State and 8 p.m., Chipola vs. South Georgia Tech.

Saturday games include: 10 a.m., Tallahassee vs. Santa Fe; noon, Northwest Florida vs. Georgia Perimeter; 2 p.m., East Florida State vs. Darton; 4 p.m., Pensacola vs. South Georgia Tech; 6 p.m., Gulf Coast vs. Georgia Highlands and 8 p.m., Chipola vs. Broward.

Four Lady Indians (pictured above) were named in the Collegiate Girls Basketball Report Top 35 preseason NJCAA player rankings: Chipola's Khadijah Ellison, Ebony Wells, Rahni Bell, and Treyvonna Brooks. Ellison, a sophomore transfer who sat out last year at Chipola, is ranked as the number one point guard in the country and the number three player overall. Wells, a 6'2 transfer from Florida State, is ranked as the number four center and 22nd player overall. Bell, who last year averaged 7.9 points per game for the Indians, is ranked as the number four shooting forward and 30th overall. Brooks, providing 5.6 points and 5.5 rebounds per game, is ranked as the number nine power forward and 33rd overall.

"The individual ratings are a testament to the work ethic they have demonstrated throughout the summer and preseason workouts", said Coach Greg Franklin. "The key will be for us to continue to improve as a collective unit."



Indians Play Friday

The Chipola Indians open the basketball season Friday, Nov. 1, in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center when they host East Georgia State College at 8 p.m.

The Indians were second in the Panhandle Conference last season and made it to the semi-final round of the 2013 state tournament to finish with a 26-5 record.

The East Georgia Bobcats had a 31-3 record last season. They won the Georgia GCAA State Championship and finished in the Elite 8 of the National Tournament in Hutchinson.
