The Chipola Indians baseball team hosts North Florida CC, Tuesday, April 12, at 5 p.m., for All-American day. People's First Community Bank will provide free hot dogs, cokes and chips to all Chipola fans beginning at 4:30 p.m.

The Indians are 7-6 in the Panhandle Conference race and 21-17 overall after splitting a recent series with Pensacola Junior College. The Indians lost 11-3 in 7 at PJC on April 3, after beating Pensacola 12-5, on April 2. Pitcher Liam Shanahan came in relief of Steven Brock in the second inning to finish the game. Chipola scored 5 runs in the second and gave up two in the third. Travis Anderson hit a two-run homer in the seventh. The Indians scored five more in the eighth.

Chipola College was recently approved to offer a new Paramedic Training Program.

Kathy Wheeler, Chipola Director of Health Science programs, said, "We are thrilled to announce that the Florida Bureau of Emergency Management Services has awarded full approval for our Paramedic Training Program. This approval comes at a time of dire need for trained paramedics in our district as well as surrounding districts."

James McMillan, a paramedic with 11 years experience, will serve as lead instructor in the new program. Wheeler said, "James is to be commended for his professional direction and composition of an excellent Paramedic Program Curriculum."

Application deadline for the new program is April 22. Only certified Emergency Medical Technicians are eligible to enroll. Classes will meet from 1 to 7 p.m., Tuesdays - Thursdays, beginning May 10.
