## Chipola instructor helps improve electronics textbook

James Bailey, Chipola College instructor in Electronics, was asked by McGraw-Hill to conduct an extensive review of an Electronics textbook, "Basic Mathematics for Electricity and Electronics" by Harry Forster and Mitchel E. Schultz.

Bailey was asked to provide the authors with candid and detailed feedback before the next textbook revision.

Bailey says one of the major concerns he hears from students is that textbooks

often fail to include enough example problems worked in each chapter. He says example problems are useful in helping students understand electronic math problems that are sometimes very difficult to solve.

Bailey developed a "problem-solved" soft cover manual for the textbook and made it available for students to purchase in the campus book store. The manual gives students a step-by-step approach to solving math problems for direct-current circuits and

alternating-current circuits. Bailey sent a copy of his "problem solved" manual to the authors along with his chapter review materials. The authors were so pleased with Bailey's manual that they plan to include selected problems in the Ninth Edition of the book in 2006.

Bailey will be named as a contributor to the book and will receive an honorarium.

## Former Chipola player makes Major League debut

Former Chipola baseball player Jose Bautista singled in his first major league at bat for the Baltimore Orioles on April 5.

Bautista was picked up by the Orioles on the Rule 5 Draft Pick in December. He entered professional baseball in May of 2001 signing with the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In an article on the Baltimore website, Orioles manager Lee Mazilli said, "He can definitely hit, and he's good with the glove. We just have to make him comfortable here. I am still not sure what to do with him, because you don't want to overwhelm the kid. But he's got some talent." Bautista proved his value on defense at third and at all three outfield slots during Spring Training. He also hit .391 this spring.

Bautista was progressing well in the Pirates system when he suffered a broken hand after punching what he thought was a fiberglass trash can following a May 2003 strikeout. The uncharacteristic act by the soft-spoken native of the Dominican Republic cost him two months of playing time and may have led to the Pirates trading him to the Orioles.

Chipola baseball coach Jeff Johnson says, "Jose is a great kid who does it the right way on and off the field." Johnson predicted Bautista's success back in 2001 when he said, "Jose's got some great tools and he has a very good chance of making it to the big leagues. He's also a kid with excellent character and class."

Bautista was a major force behind Chipola's success during the 2000 and 2001 seasons, leading the Indians to back-to-back conference championships and state tournament appearances. In 2001, he led the Indians in homeruns with 15 and was fifth on the state list. He finished the year with a .326 batting average including 15 doubles, 15 hr, and 47 RBI's, and 12 stolen bases. A utility player, Bautista also turned out to be a very effective pitcher with 16 appearances on the year and five saves. He was the winning pitcher in Chipola's 5-3 win over Okaloosa-Walton that gave the Indians the Panhandle Conference championship.

Bautista led Chipola to a second place finish in the 2001 State Tournament, and was named tournament MVP after pitching

an entire nine-inning game in Chipola's 8-4 win over St. Pete in game three. He amassed a 7-1 pitching mark, striking out 25 batters in 33 1/3 innings, and chalking up a 2.43 ERA.

He hit .325 during his freshman year at Chipola, including 19 doubles, three triples, eight homeruns and drove in 52 RBI's. Additionally, he stole 22 bases on the season.

Bautista was named an Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar by *Black Issues in Higher Education* magazine in 2001. Student-athletes nominated for the award must compete in an intercollegiate sport; maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.2; and be active on their campuses or in their communities.

As a business major at Chipola, Bautista maintained a 3.5 GPA. He also was active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.
