Chipola awarded at Phi Theta Kappa Convention

The Nu Chi Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa at Chipola College received the following awards at the recent 2004 Phi Theta Kappa International Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota: Scholarship Hallmark Award, Fellowship Hallmark Award, Beta Alpha Continued Excellence Award, Pinnacle Continued Excellence Award, and the *USA Today* Case Study Challenge Award.

Nearly 500 chapters competed for the Society's most coveted awards. The Hallmark Awards Program is the society's capstone awards competition annually recognizing excellence in programs that promote the Phi Theta Kappa Hallmarks of Scholarship, Leadership, Service and Fellowship. Only ten chapters receive this distinguished recognition.

The Beta Alpha Continued Excellence Award honors outstanding Phi Theta Kappa chapters that have been named top 25 chapters for three consecutive years. Nu Chi was one of eight chapters nationwide to be given this honor.

By increasing the number of members in their chapter by at least 10% for three consecutive years, Nu Chi also received the Pinnacle Continued Excellence Award. This is the highest membership honor Phi Theta Kappa bestows to individual chapters.

The *USA Today* Case Study Challenge annually honors chapters or individuals who research and write a comprehensive case study relating to Phi Theta Kappa's Honors Study Topic. Nu Chi

was one of the four nationwide recipients for their case study, entitled, "Stress: The Workforce Epidemic," and was awarded a cash prize of \$500. Their case study will be published on the USA Today website at the end of April.

The Phi Theta Kappa International Convention was the pinnacle of an extremely rewarding and successful year for Nu Chi. Last summer, the chapter conceptualized an ambitious service-learning program, "A Day in the Life: The 20/20 Challenge," which challenged members of the campus, community, and region to collectively donate 20,000 hours of community service and \$20,000 to charitable causes throughout the academic year. Through comprehensive service-learning projects, including the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life and The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's Team In Training, the chapter volunteered over 20,600 service learning hours and donated over \$33,000 to charity.

Phi Theta Kappa, the International Honor Society of the Two-Year College, has recognized academic excellence since 1918. The Society is comprised of more than 1,200 chapters at community, technical and junior colleges in all 50 states, Canada, Germany and U.S. territories abroad, making it the largest and most prestigious honor society serving two-year colleges. The organization offers opportunities for scholarships, intellectual enrichment and personal development through programs based on the society's hallmarks.

Press Conference Monday to honor Academic All Americans

Chipola College students—Kimberly Rogers and Joni Goodman—will be recognized at a press conference, Monday, April 26, at 10 a.m. in the Lobby of the Literature/Language Building.

The students have been named Academic All-Americans and will be featured in the April 26 edition of *USA Today*. This honor ranks the Chipola students in the top 60 among the 11 million community college students in the country.

The Chipola sophomores also were named first-team members of the All-Florida Academic Team.

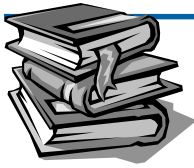
Chipola offers day and evening college credit courses, as well as Independent
