Chipola's Prichard is Florida College Student of the Year



Chipola Junior College sophomore Chrissie Prichard was named Florida College Student of the Year on Friday, April 11, at a ceremony at the state Capitol in Tallahassee.

Florida Leader magazine selected Prichard from among seven finalists and exceptional campus leaders in the 16th annual Florida College Student of the Year Awards program.

The event later will be televised statewide on The Sunshine Network. The prestigious awards program recognizes students who support themselves financially through college, excel academically, and are involved in community service and political activism.

Prichard is a sophomore majoring in Civil Engineering. She recently was named to the All-USA Academic Team which places her in the top 10 students in a pool of over 10 million community college students. Prichard was featured in an April 7 article in *USA Today*. Prichard is the fourth CJC student in the last five years to be named to the *USA Today* Community College All Academic Team.

Prichard is a cheerleader, Honors Program student, a Student Ambassador, SGA Senator and is active in the local chapter of Phi

Theta Kappa, the international honor society for two-year colleges. In 2002, she was one of ten students in America chosen to receive the Phi Theta Kappa Leaders of Promise Scholarship.

She was selected as a New Century Scholar, the award given to the top student in the state on the All-Florida team. Prichard also was named a Guistwhite Scholar, Phi Theta Kappa's most prestigious award.

She served as 2000 Florida Beef Ambassador for the Florida Cattlemen's Association. As the 2000 valedictorian of Chipley High School, she was awarded the Chipola Valedictorian Scholarship. She earned the Florida Academic Scholar award that pays college tuition for students with a 3.5 GPA and a minimum ACT score of 28. She won Chipola's Calculus II Award in 2002 for maintaining the highest grades in CJC Calculus courses.

Prichard serves as a volunteer student tutor and as a computer tutor for local senior citizens. She works countless hours on CJC projects including: voter registration, American Cancer Society, Pregnancy Crisis Centers and Project Graduation. She is the daughter of David and Caren Prichard of Chipley.

CJC president Dr. Gene Prough said, "Chrissie is a one in a million student. She is involved in every area of campus and community life, and she excels at all of them."

Chipola theatre receives high honors

Chipola's recent sold out production of "Big River" has received highest honors from the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival and the Florida Association of Community Colleges theatre division.

CJC Theatre coordinator Charles Sirmon, who entered the Kennedy Center Festival for his first time at CJC, said, "I was very excited to share my work with other theater professionals and receive educated theatrical responses."

Representatives from the KCACTF attended the performance. One representative wrote, "If the work and effort I witnessed in this production is any indication, we have nothing but great things to expect from Chipola Theatre."

CJC Baseball team leads Panhandle Conference

The Chipola Indians host NFL on Tuesday, April 15 at 5 p.m. in a crucial conference baseball game.

The Indians team maintained their one game lead in first place in the Panhandle Conference after sweeping Gulf Coast in three weekend games. As of Monday, April 13, the league standings are: Chipola (13-5), Okaloosa-Walton (12-6), Tallahassee (12-6), Pensacola (8-10), North Florida (6-12), Gulf Coast (3-15).

The Indians scored a big 13-4 win over GCC on Sunday, April 13. Brian Clausen (8-2) got the win for Chipola. Leading hitters for CJC were Matt Grooms, who was 3 for 5; Adam Loewen, who was 3 for 3 with 2 RBI; and Cole Armstrong, who was 3 for 4 with 4 RBI.

On Saturday, April 12, the Indians beat Gulf Coast in both halves of a doubleheader, 8-2 and 3-1. Friedel Pinkston was the winning pitcher in game one. Victor Alvarez was 1 for 1 with 2 runs and 2 RBI. Joey Wilson was 2 for 4 with 3 RBI.

Adam Dunavant earned the 3-1 win in game two on Saturday. Matt Grooms was 2 for 2 with a homerun. JP Lowen was 1 for 2 with a homerun.

The Indians also host TCC, Friday, April 18 at 5 p.m. Chipola hosts PJC in the final home game of the season on Tuesday, April 22 at 5 p.m.

The top two teams in the conference earn a berth to the state tournament.

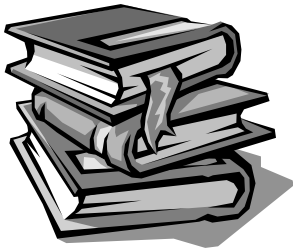
Phi Beta Lambda News
