## Early registration for summer classes at Chipola

Chipola College will hold early summer registration for current students, Tuesday, April 15, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Wednesday, April 16, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Summer I classes begin May 6. Summer II classes begin June 23. Many evening and distance learning courses are available during the two six-week summer sessions. Some classes have been extended to run for 12 weeks rather than 6.

Current students with 30 or more hours may register for both terms on April 15. Current students with one or more hour may register for both terms on April 16. Online registration also is available for students who qualify.

Fees for early registration must be paid by April 24. Scholarship recipients should contact the Business Office by April 24 to declare fee payment method. Students from Georgia and Alabama pay in-state tuition.

New students planning to enroll in Summer I classes are encouraged to apply by the April 21 deadline. New student registration for Summer I is May 5. Students who take at least one class during either summer term may register early for Fall 2008 classes.

## Lady Indians clinch state tourney berth; baseball still one game behind

The **Lady Indians** clinched a spot in the state softball tournament after sweeping North Florida in a pair of games on April 13. Brooke Muth earned the win for Chipola in game one with a 3-1 victory. Amber Weeks was the winning pitcher in game two, 6-3.

Chipola split a pair with TCC on April 10. Brooke Muth was the winning pitcher in Chipola’s 4-3 win in game one. Tera Gainer hit a solo homerun in the top of the seventh. Melody Moore and Chasity Covington were both 2 for 4. Tallahassee won game two, 6-2. Covington was 2 for 3. Hali Barfield hit a 2-run single.

The Lady Indians (13-3) lead the Panhandle Softball Conference race. Gulf Coast (12-4) is in second. PJC (8-8) is third. TCC is 7-9. OW is 5-11. NFL is 3-13.

Chipola hosts Okaloosa-Walton, Tuesday, April 15, at 4 p.m., in the final home game of the season. The Lady Indians finish league play at Gulf Coast on April 17.

The defending state and national champion Lady Indians are ranked fourth in the FCCAA state poll. Gulf Coast is second.

The defending national champion **Chipola Indians** held onto second place in the conference race after sweeping Gulf Coast in a pair of weekend games.

Ben Jeffers was the winning pitcher in Chipola’s 10-2 win on April 12. Three Indians—Jordan Lucas, Einar Atencio and Adam Duvall—hit homeruns in the game. Matt Jackson earned the win in Chipola’s 10-5 win over Gulf Coast on April 11.

With four games remaining, Chipola (11-5) is two games behind first place Pensacola (12-3). TCC is (8-8). North Florida is (7-8). Gulf Coast is 5-11 and OW is 4-12. The top two teams in the league earn a berth in the state tournament in May.

Chipola hosts OW, Tuesday, April 15, at 5 p.m. before heading to Niceville on April 16. Chipola’s last home game of the conference season is a 5 p.m. game with North Florida on Friday, April 18. The Indians finish out the season at North Florida on April 19.

The defending state and national champion Indians are fourth in the FCCAA State Poll.

Show Choir auditions are Tuesday, April 22, at 4 p.m. in the Arts Center. with solo vocal auditions followed by a group dance routine. The Show Choir is open to all full-time students. Incoming freshmen and current Chipola students are encouraged to audition. Students should come with: comfortable clothes and shoes for the dance audition; a completed Show Choir Application (available in the Fine Arts Office or on the Chipola Website [www.chipola.edu](http://www.chipola.edu) (Fine and Performing Arts Page – Music Department), and an accompanied vocal solo. Students must bring either sheet music or an accompaniment track. Unaccompanied auditions are not accepted.

High School graduates with acceptable academic records and music, theatre, and art aptitude who plan to pursue studies as music, theatre or art majors are eligible to apply. Scholarships in various amounts, up to full tuition and fees, are awarded on the basis of talent and academic record. Students with financial need may seek additional assistance through the college’s Office of Financial Aid and the Chipola Foundation.

Music teacher Amanda Kay Johnson received grants for Hope School and for Jackson Alternative School to purchase musical instrumentals and instructional resources. Gayle Grissett from W.R. Tolar School in Liberty County received a grant for “Kodaly Approach” to Music Literacy. Janet Edeward from Blountstown Middle and High Schools will share how monies were used for the middle school production of “Treasure Island,” the high school production of “The Music Man,” and art supplies to make personality masks.

CRAA awarded 23 mini-grants to enhance the arts in schools. Tallahassee artist Mark J. Fletcher will present an exhibit entitled, “Essential Nature” in the gallery of the McLendon Fine Arts Building on the Chipola College campus, April 13 through May 3. The exhibit is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Fletcher had already built his own kick wheel and two wood-fired kilns in his backyard by the end of high school, but it was during his apprenticeship with a ceramic artist in Japan that he developed his art through the medium of clay.

Due to budget and enrollment constraints, Florida State University has moved their transfer application deadline (for Florida AA students) for Fall 2008 to April 4. Students missing this deadline will be considered late applicants. FSU main campus Admissions Office has said they will work with Chipola AA graduates who plan to transfer in the fall **IF** they make contact by April 16. Deadline for late applicants to apply and all academic credentials must be received by Wednesday, April 16 or the application will be cancelled. Students should seek assistance from Chipola academic advisor Lindsay Roach in A114.

Students who have already been sent a hold letter because we are awaiting CLAST and/or foreign language will have until May 15, to provide proof that they have met these requirements.

FSU main campus has also closed spring 2009 admissions to all but transfers with a Florida AA degree. Students need to apply early for spring 2009.
