## Chipola Phi Theta Kappa wins international awards

Chipola Junior College's chapter of Phi Theta Kappa received international recognition at the 84<sup>th</sup> annual International Phi Theta Kappa Convention held recently in Nashville. Chipola's Nu Chi chapter received one of ten Leadership Hallmark awards and advisor Jody Spooner received a 2002 Distinguished Advisor Award.

Faculty Adviser Jody Spooner said, "This recognition was even more amazing given that only two Florida chapters (Chipola and St. Petersburg College) received awards in our Hallmark areas. We received two International Hallmark Awards, including one for Leadership, which is awarded to only ten chapters among the 450 chapters that applied."

International awards were based on the chapter's ability to incorporate the four hallmarks of Phi Theta Kappa: leadership, scholarship, service and fellowship, into their activities. Chipola's PTK members worked on a month-long service project to help the needy in the community. Students also raised money for children at Christ-

mas, held food drives and collected school supplies for elementary school students. Earlier this year, the group sponsored its second annual Honors Day for High School Juniors on the CJC campus.

Chipola students joined over 3,500 PTK members and alumni April 3-6 for the convention, which is the largest convention of college students in the nation. Students attended educational forums relating to leadership, service and recruitment. Students also had the opportunity to hear some high-profile speakers, including Trisha Yearwood,

who was presented with the 2002 Distinguished Alumni Award; a debate between Democrat James Carville and Republican Newt Gingrich and an address on "Healing with Joy" by Dr. Patch Adams.

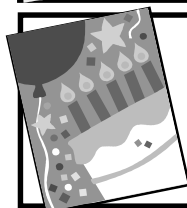

Novelist and award-winning writer Pamela Ball will read from her new book, "The Floating City," on April 16 as the featured guest for the Chipola Regional Arts Association which meets at Jim's Buffet and Grill on Lafayette Street.

Ball, who lives in Tallahassee, was born and raised on the island of Oahu. "The Floating City" (Viking Penguin, \$23.95), as well as her 1997 debut novel, "Lava" (Norton, \$21), is set in Hawaii.

The historical novel "Floating City" takes place during the 1890s when the Hawaiian monar-

chy was being overthrown. The book tells the story of Eva Hanson, a Norwegian fortune-teller with a dubious past. She unwittingly gets caught in the middle of a politically charged murder investigation.

The book has garnered glowing reviews from papers and magazines around the nation. Ball moved to Florida in the 1980s and studied creative writing at Florida State University.

**Chipola pool to open April 15**

The Chipola Pool opens April 15 with a variety of aquatic activities on tap.

Swimming pool hours are Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. The pool is available for party rentals and lap swimming.

Pool admission is \$2 for children under 13 and \$3 for all others. Season passes are available for all leisure pool hours from April through September. Individual passes are \$55. Family passes are \$85 for two or three persons, \$95 for four or five persons and \$10 for each additional person above five. Swim Team passes are \$90 for parents and one child, \$120 for parents and two children and \$10 for each additional child above two.

An **American Red Cross Lifeguard Course** will be scheduled later this month. The class is limited to the first 10 applicants. Michelle Stratton will teach the course.

**Swimming lessons** for all ability levels will be offered for ages two and up. Lessons are based on a combination of nationally recognized methods. The Chipola Indians moved one step closer to the state tournament with an 11-1 route of North Florida at home Wednesday.

Randy Roth led with a grand slam. Joey Wilson had a two-run homer to give the Indians a sufficient lead to finish the game in five innings.

TJ Large pitched the first four innings. Eric Johnson finished in the fifth.

The game marked the second Chipola win over North Florida in as many days. Chipola also whipped North Florida, 6-2 on Tuesday, April 9. Ivan Nacarata hit a three-run homer with two outs and the score tied at 2-2 in the ninth. Blake Balckom followed up with a solo homer to push the score to 6-2.

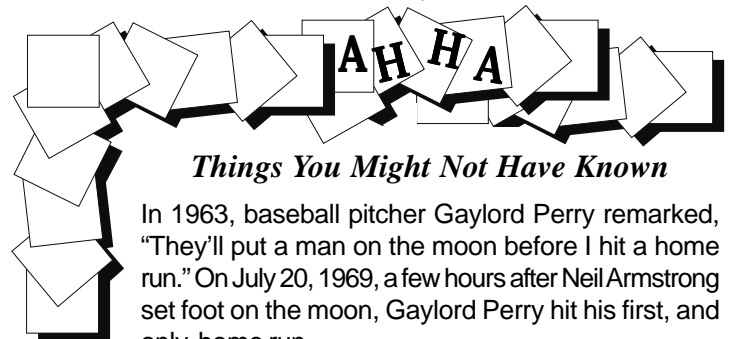
