## Chipola's Cartwright and Walker named to All-Florida Academic Team

Chipola students Sarah Cartwright of Marianna and Thomas Walker of Sneads have been named to the 2007 All-Florida Academic First Team.



Team represent 28 of Florida's public community colleges, one independent two-year college, and one independent university.

Education Commissioner Jeanine Blomberg and Community Colleges Vice Chancellor Judith Bilsky announced the members of the Academic Team at a press conference in Tallahassee.

Students on the All-Florida Academic Team are nominated by their respective colleges to the All-USA Academic Team competition sponsored by *USA Today* and the Phi Theta Kappa. College presidents submit nominations based on GPA; participation in honors programs; awards, academic achievement; and service to the college and the community.

**Sarah Cartwright** is a member of the Chipola Honors program. She is Freshman Senator in SGA; Secretary of Student Ambassadors; and Phi Theta Kappa (Nu Chi Chapter): International Service Officer. She is a member of the Chipola Governance Council; Show Choir, Science Club, New Friends, Baptist Collegiate Ministry, Who's Who in American Junior Colleges, the National Dean's List and was named a Coca-Cola Scholar in 2006.

Cartwright was a 2005 Valedictorian at Marianna High School. She plans to major in Microbiology and Cell Science, Nutrition or Biology. Cartwright is the daughter of Steve and Lesia Cartwright of Marianna.

**TJ Walker** of Sneads also was named a member of the First Team All Academic Team. He won the Leader of Promise award from Phi Theta Kappa honor society in 2006

At Chipola, Walker is the PTK Fellowship/Membership Officer and a member of the Honors Program. He won the Freshman Accounting award, and was named to Who's Who in American Junior Colleges.

## Lady Indians lead national and state Softball polls



The Chipola Lady Indians have taken control of the NJCAA Division I Softball Poll sending defending National Champion Pima Community College (Ariz.) to No. 2 for the week of March 27.

Chipola received 80 total poll points and four first place votes.

The Lady Indians also top the state FCCAA poll. Chipola leads the league with a 7-1 conference mark.

Chipola picked up four wins last week over Region 8 foes. The Indians took two games from Lake City Community College on March 23 by

the scores of 5-4 and 7-3. Then on March 24 they swept Okaloosa-Walton College 7-0 and 10-5.

Lady Indians' pitcher Cassie Lassiter continued her dominance by picking up three wins, which improves her record to 14-1 with the fifth-best ERA in the country (0.620). As a team, Chipola boasts a team batting average of .379.

## Indians lead baseball conference



The Chipola baseball team improved to 8-2 in league play Thursday, March 29, with an 8-6 win over Okaloosa-Walton.

Chipola scored 3 in the second, but OW answered with 4 runs. OW led 6 to 5 heading into the final frame, but the Indians went up 8-6 and were able to hold on with the bases loaded, with two outs in the ninth, getting the win on a pop fly to end it.

Chipola leads the Panhandle Conference race and is currently ranked fifth in the FCCAA State Poll. Jesus Barroso leads the team in runs-scored with 25.

The Indians (20-13 overall) host Pensacola, Tuesday, April 3 at 5 p.m., North Florida, Thursday, April 5 at 5 p.m.; and North Florida, Saturday, April 7 at 1 p.m.
