Chipola students honored for academics

Chipola College officials recognized the academic accomplishments of four students during a press conference Thursday.

TJ Walker was named to *USA Today's* All-American Academic Second Team and to the All Florida Academic First Team. **Krystle Shelton** was one of 20 students recognized internationally as a Guistwhite Scholar. **Sarah Cartwright** was named to the All Florida Academic First team. **Buddy Clark** was one of 20 students recognized internationally as an outstanding member of Phi Theta Kappa.

Chipola English instructor **Pam Rentz** is faculty adviser to the college chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, the International Honor Society of Two-Year Colleges.

TJ Walker of Sneads was named to the *USA Today* All Academic Second Team which was featured in the April 16 issue of *USA Today*. He is a member of the First Team All Academic Team. He was named a Leader of Promise by Phi Theta Kappa in 2006. At Chipola, Walker was the PTK Fellowship/Membership Officer and a member of the Honors Program. He won the Freshman Accounting award, and was named to Who's Who in American Junior Colleges.



Walker was the 2005 Valedictorian of Sneads High. He is currently enrolled at Florida State University pursuing a major in Multi-National Business. Walker is the son of William and Mary Walker of Grand Ridge.

Krystle Shelton of Altha was one of 20 students in the world chosen as a Guistwhite Scholar by Phi Theta Kappa. Students from more than 1,700 community colleges are eligible for the annual award which includes a \$5,000 scholarship.

Panhandle Champion Indians to finish regular season

The Panhandle Champion Chipola Indians continued their domination of the league with a two-game sweep of North Florida on April 17-18.

The Indians scored a 5-2 win over North Florida on April 17. Winning pitcher Ryan Chaffee relieved Kevin Mc Coy who went the first 3 innings. Tom Hatcher had 3 hits, including two home runs and 3- RBI's

Chipola blasted NFL 13-3 on April 18. Kyle Regnault got the win for Chipola.

As of April 19, the Indians are 31-15 overall and 19-4 conference play. Gulf Coast (13-10) and PJC (12-11) are in a battle for second place and a spot in the state tourney.

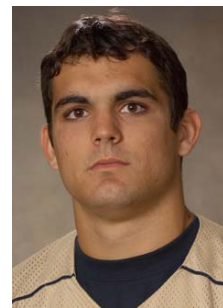
Chipola will represent the Panhandle as Conference Cham-

pion in the FCCAA State Tournament, May 3-8, at Chain of Lakes Stadium in Winter Haven, FL.

Chipola hosts Tallahassee, Friday, April 20 at 5 p.m. The Indians host L.B. Wallace in a non-conference game at 2 p.m., Tuesday, May 1.

The Indians are fourth in the FCCAA state poll behind Palm Beach in first, St. Pete in second and Miami-Dade in third.

Lady Indians take Panhandle Conference crown

The Lady Indians captured with Panhandle Conference Championship winning five of the last six games in league play.

The squad also held onto their number one ranking in the NJCAA Division I Softball Poll for the fourth-consecutive week.

Florida teams in the national poll include No. 1 Chipola, No. 3 Manatee, No. 4 Indian River, No. 8 Santa Fe and No. 10 Gulf Coast.

Chipola split a double-header with Tallahassee on April 17. The Lady Indians game won 10-4 behind winning pitcher Cassie Lassiter. The Lady Indians fell 5-3 in game two with Brittany Minton on the mound.

Chipola's overall record is 43-6-1 and 15-3 in league play.

Chipola picked up two doubleheader sweeps of Region 8 opponents last week when they defeated North Florida on April 11, 7-1 and 9-0, and then took down Okaloosa-Walton 8-0 and 9-2 on April 14.

Much of Chipola's success this season comes from three great

pitchers. Cassie Lassiter and Brittany Minton boast impressive records of 18-2 and 15-1, respectively. Lassiter has an impressive 0.787 ERA, while Minton has a 0.801 ERA.

Chipola's number three pitcher Amber Weeks of Sneads, FL, boasts the best ERA on the team with a 0.580 mark, the fourth best in the NJCAA. In 60.1 innings pitched this season Weeks has given up just five earned runs and struck-out 33 opposing batters. She has a 6-1 record this season.

Also contributing to the Indians great season is a solid offensive line-up that features five regular starters with batting averages over .400: Martina Landrum (.480), Sara Lovestrand (.492), Alyssa Shirey (.453), Lassiter (.418) and Megan Whitehead (.417).

The Lady Indians host Darton College on April 25.
