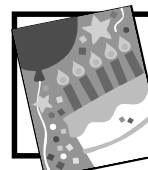


Chipola Baseball This Week

Chipola baseballers sign with universities

Two more Chipola baseball players announced Monday that they will move on to Division 1 ball after their career at CJC.

Pitcher Les Hassen signed with Florida Gulf Coast University in Naples. Florida Gulf Coast is the state's newest public university. Hassen is a 6'1 right-hander from Port Charlotte, FL. The right-handed pitcher had a 6-2 record this season and six saves last year.

Blake Balkcom of Chipley recently signed a scholarship to play for Florida State University. The 6'2 right-handed outfielder is hitting .396 on the year. He leads the state in homeruns with 17. Balkcom also hit 10 doubles, a triple and 58 RBI's.

The **Indians captured the 2002 Panhandle conference championship** on April 14 with a 10-2 win over Gulf Coast. Balkcom had a solo homerun in the game. Balkcom also was a key in Chipola's 2001 Conference Championship and second place

Four Chipola Junior College basketball players have signed with Division 1 colleges.

Signees include: Kareem Johnson—University of Cincinnati; Wayne Bransom—University of Louisiana at Monroe; John Andrews—University of Louisiana at Monroe and David Hilton—Drexel University.

Kareem Johnson, a 6-8 forward from Eufaula, AL, led Chipola in scoring and rebounding this season with a 10.6 per game rebounding average and 16.6 points per game scoring mark.

Chipola hosts Game of Life Program for Eighth-grade students

More than 1,000 eighth-graders from surrounding counties attended a motivational program entitled "The Game of Life" held recently at Chipola.

Speakers included: Waymond King, assistant secretary for marketing of the Florida Lottery; Dennis Webber, director of Alternative Education for Levy County Schools; and Dr. David B. Langston, president/CEO of the Norris Langston Youth Foundation, a non-profit program created in honor of Langston's late brother.

Langston, who also directs the Education Community Institute within the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice, said, "This program is intended to bring middle school students onto a college cam-

finish in the 2001 state tournament. He hit .320 in his freshman year at CJC.

Chipola will play the Mid-Florida Runner-Up on May 5 at 6 p.m. in the state tournament in Melbourne in the Marlins spring training facility.

The Indians are ranked first in the state and third in the nation at 37-8 and 16-3 in the conference. Last season, the Indians finished second in the state tournament with a 43-16 record and a Panhandle Conference Championship. Johnson has led the Indians to state four times in six seasons at the helm of the CJC program.

Four other Indians signed with four-year colleges in the Fall. Russell Martin will play at North Carolina State University. Kyle Pawelczyk signed with Louisiana State University. Johnny Lynch will play at the University of South Alabama and Ricardo Nanita signed with Florida International University.

Wayne Bransom, a 6-8 forward from Pittsburgh, PA, averaged 8.8 points, 9.8 rebounds and 44 total assists.

John Andrews, a 6-4 guard from Havana, FL, averaged 13.8 points and 4 rebounds per game.

David Hilton, a 5-11 guard from New York City, transferred to CJC from the University of Hawaii. He led CJC in assists with 161 total dishes in 28 games. He also averaged 7 points per game.

The Indians finished the season with an 18-12 overall record.

Chipola baseball team headed to State Tourney

A state tournament send-off party for the Chipola Indians baseball team is set for Friday, May 3, at 10 a.m., at the CJC Residence Hall on Longhouse Court.

Chipola will play the Mid-Florida Runner-Up on Sunday, May 5 at 6 p.m. in the state tournament in Melbourne at the Marlins spring training facility. Chipola's opponent is yet to be determined from among Seminole, Lake Sumter, or Santa Fe.

The Indians enter the tournament as the top-ranked team in the state, and the number three team in the country, with back-to-back Panhandle conference championships. Chipola finished the regular season at 35-8 and 14-3 in the conference.

The Indians will need to win at least four games and possibly five to take the state championship. The championship game is scheduled for Thursday, May 9. Chipola's games will be broadcast by Deep South Sports on WJAQ, 100.9-FM. The national tournament is held in Grand Junction, Colorado.

CJC head coach Jeff Johnson is optimistic about his team's outlook. "We've got as good a chance as we've ever had to do very well in the tournament. When you get to state, all the clubs are quality clubs. We just want to take it one game at a time."

Experience is on Chipola's side this year. Some 10 players return from last year's squad which finished second to Miami-Dade in the 2001 tourney. Johnson is hopeful that this experience will help. "You like to think that it will help to have a bunch of sophomores who have been to the tournament before. They won't be awestruck by all of the excitement, and they can help the freshman maintain their composure. Hopefully our sophomores are hungry after last year and will want to have a little better outcome."

Johnson has led the Indians to state four times in six seasons at the helm of the CJC program.

Chipola is loaded with sophomores who were part of the 2001 squad that finished second in the

state tournament with a 43-16 record and a Panhandle Conference Championship.

Outfielder Blake Balkcom of Chipley has been a key to Chipola's offensive success. The sophomore leads the state in homeruns with 17. He is hitting .396, with 10 doubles, a triple and 58 RBI's. He recently signed with FSU. Ricardo Nanita of Santa Domingo, Dominican Republic is a great hitter and a clutch hitter with a .418 average. He has chalked up 14 doubles, a triple, 11 homeruns and 55 RBI's. He signed with Florida International University in the Fall.

Aussie Scott Wearne was a member of the Australian Junior National Team. The two-year starting outfielder is hitting .355 with 10 doubles and 28 RBI's.

Three Indians played for the Canadian Junior National Team. Ivan Nacaratta, a two-year starter at second base is batting .365 with 12 homeruns and 48 RBI's. Outfielder Eric Bernier is a two-year starter with a strong bat. Third baseman Russell Martin is hitting .325 with 15 doubles, 4 homeruns and 32 RBI's. He will play at NC State next year.

The Indians are loaded with sophomore pitchers, including Les Hassen right handed transfer from Punta Gorda, FL. He's one of the top arms on the staff with a 6-2 record. He recently signed with Florida Gulf Coast University, the state's newest university.

Chad Coffee, a right-hander from Leesburg, GA, has been a great contributor. Troy Fry of Nazareth, Pennsylvania, has a 6-1 record. The right-hander is one of CJC's top relievers out of the bullpen, and is considering offers from several top schools.

Johnny Lynch of Rogers Minnesota is a left-hander whose played a big part the last two years as a starter and a reliever. He signed with South Alabama in the Fall.

Kyle Pawelczyk from Elkins, West Virginia, may be the strongest in the rotation. The left-hander has a 6-1 record and has been one of the Indians' top starters for two years. He will play at LSU next Fall.

The CJC Health Science department will offer both the Certified Nursing Assistant program and an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) refresher course in the coming weeks.

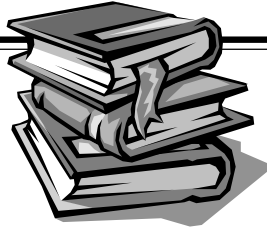

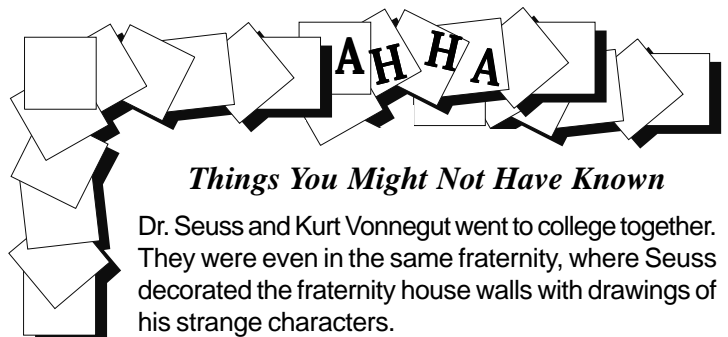
