



Rep. Allan Bense to speak at Chipola College on Monday

Rep. Allan Bense, the incoming Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives, is the keynote speaker for a back-to-school luncheon, Monday, Aug. 16, at Chipola.

The event begins at 11:30 a.m. in the Chipola Arts Center on College Street. Prior to Bense's speech, Chipola president Dr. Gene Prough will address the college's 200 employees, introduce new faculty and staff

and recognize employees for years of service. Bense's speech will begin at 12:30 p.m.

Dr. Prough said, "We are proud that Rep. Bense will be on our campus for our back-to-school activities. He is a great friend to Chipola College and a strong supporter of Florida's entire educational system."

Rep. Bense was elected to the House of Representatives in 1998, to serve District 6, which includes portions of Bay County, all

of Gulf County, and the city of Apalachicola in Franklin County. Currently, he serves as Chairman of the House Committee on Procedures which oversees the Subcommittees on Ethics & Elections and Rules.

Bense was named Speaker-designate on Sept. 30, 2003. He is slated to become Speaker of the House in November of 2004 and will preside over the 2005-2006 legislative sessions.

The son of a Northwest Florida dairy farmer, he is a lifelong resident of Bay County and is a partner in several companies with interests in construction, road building, and golf course development.

Bense is a graduate of Florida State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business and an MBA.

He has been an active community leader for the past two decades. He is married to the former Tonie Lynne Johnson. They have three children: Courtney, a governmental consultant in Tallahassee; Jason, a junior on Jacksonville University football team; and, Taylor, a sophomore at Bay High School and budding musician.
