## Chipola's Cartwright is Coca-Cola Scholar

Chipola student Sarah Cartwright of Marianna has been awarded a scholarship from the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation.

Coca-Cola Tallahassee Area Youth Market Manager Dextrix Demps recently presented the award to Cartwright. The award—based on outstanding academic and service learning achievements—places Cartwright among the top community college students in the nation.

Cartwright is a member of the Chipola Honors program. She is Freshman Senator in Student Government; Secretary of Student Ambassadors; Phi Theta Kappa: International, Service Officer. She is a member of the Chipola Governance Council; Show Choir, Science Club, New Friends, Baptist Collegiate Ministry, Who's Who in American Junior Colleges, and National Dean's List.

Cartwright was a 2005 Valedictorian at Marianna High School where she was a student in the Honors program. She was Student Government class secretary; Beta Club Vice President and State Science Competition and State Quiz Bowl Team. She was also named High School Who's Who; All-American Scholar Award; USAA National Science Merit Award; National Honor Roll; National Honor Society; Latin I Award, Honors Biology Award; and Distinguished Bulldog.

Cartwright has worked at Everest Medical Care since March 2004. She is plans to major in Microbiology and Cell Science, Nutrition or Biology.

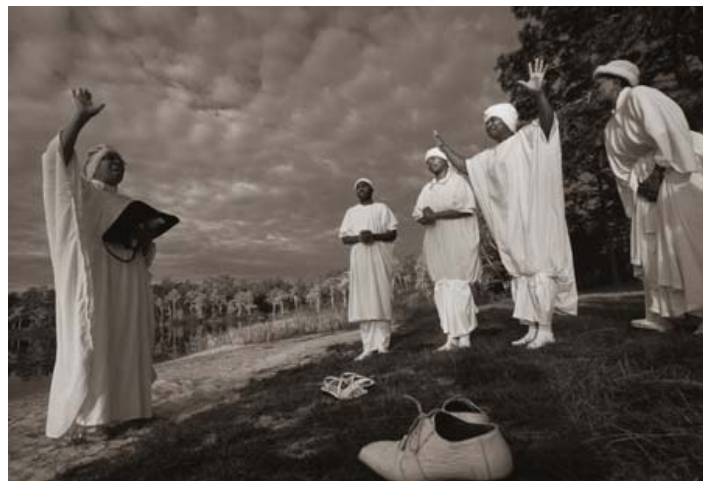
An **Introduction to Computers with Internet for Seniors** course will meet Sept. 12 from 9 a.m. to noon. Cost is \$24.

## Chipola Baseball well represented in the Major League

Chipola College is well represented in Major League Baseball these days thanks to three former Indians who are playing exceptionally well.

Los Angeles Dodger's catcher Russell Martin is in the running for Rookie of the Year with a .286 batting average in his first season in the big leagues. He has hit 6 important homeruns to push LA to a 66-61 mark in the American League West. Martin led Chipola to a second place finish in the 2002 JUCO State Tournament.

Adam Loewen, a left-handed pitcher for the Baltimore Orioles, is 4-4 in his first season, but is 3-1 in his last four starts. The big 6-5 Canadian logged a pair of wins over the Yankees in August. Loewen led Chipola

to a state tournament appearance in 2003.

Pittsburgh Pirate third baseman Jose Bautista is batting .253 in his third season in the majors. Bautista has 13 homeruns and 34 RBI's this season. He led Chipola to a second place finish in the 2001 state JUCO tourney.

In ten seasons at the helm of the Chipola program, head coach Jeff Johnson has a combined record of 350-178 and has advanced to the state Region VIII tournament six times. The Indians finished second in the state tournament in 2005, 2002 and 2001, and third in 1998.

ference five times in the last six years, including this year's co-champion title. Johnson has helped more than 75 players move on to the professional ranks or to four-year colleges.

**STUDENT IDS.** All students are required to have a Chipola ID in their possession while on the Chipola campus. ID's must be presented for students to have access to the library and computer labs, to receive free or reduced admission to fine arts or athletic events, to pick up checks from the business office, and to take final exams. Student ID's are made only on Tuesdays (8:00 – 11:00 and 1:00 – 3:30) and Wednesdays (8:00 – 11:00) in A-107.



**PARKING REMINDER.** White and unpainted spots are for students. Green parking spots are for Chipola employees. Red designates fire lanes and blue is for disabled persons.

Parking fines are \$20 and up. Students are required to display parking decals. Failure to pay fines will result in a hold on registration and student records.



**HANDICAP PARKING.** New handicap parking permits are available in the Office for Students with Disabilities in Building G, Room 109. The new permit is to be displayed on the rearview mirror. Only students with the special permit will be allowed to park in handicapped parking on campus. If you have a documented disability, whether or not you currently possess a college handicap sticker, you should pick up your permit right away.
