## Chipola's Fall Registration begins Monday, August 18

Registration for Fall classes at Chipola College begins Monday, Aug. 18, for returning students. New student testing also begins Aug. 18.

Registration for new and returning students continues Aug. 19 and 20. Classes begin Aug. 21. Late registration runs through noon on Aug. 28.

Chipola's open-door policy guarantees acceptance to any student with a standard high school diploma. Students may register through the final hour of late registration; however, all tuition and fees are due on the day of registration.

Students who have not applied for financial aid must pay out of pocket for tuition. After applying for financial aid, those who qualify will be reimbursed usually within six to eight weeks. Prospective students should complete a college application which is available in the Office of Admissions and Records, or online at [www.chipola.edu](http://www.chipola.edu). Students also must provide an official high school or college transcript.

Chipola offers day and evening courses, as well as independent study and online courses in more than 40 individual pro-

grams, including BS, AA, AS, AAS, Workforce Certificates and Continuing Education.

The college is offering a compressed schedule this Fall with classes Monday through Thursday from 7:30 am to 3:30 p.m. The new four-day schedule should help students save on fuel costs and allow students to work on Fridays.

## Living Waters Exhibit coming to Chipola College

"Living Waters: Aquatic Preserves of Florida," a multi-media experience of film and photographs will be on display beginning Sept. 8 in the Chipola College Arts Center.

The public is invited to the premier opening of the exhibit, Thursday, Sept. 11, from 6 to 9 p.m. (CST). The free evening of art, film, music and refreshments, will include discussions and demonstrations by the artists.

The exhibit features photography, film and music inspired by the Florida's natural waterways, including a collection of 29 fine art photographic images by Clyde Butcher, renowned Florida Everglades photographer, and a screening of the PBS film "Living Waters: Aquatic Preserves of Florida," by documentary film maker Elam Stoltzfus.

For more than a decade, Stoltzfus and his Live Oak Production Group, have captured rare images of natural Florida, with Living Waters winning a coveted Crystal Reel award for excellence. The film showcases a dozen of the state's 41 aquatic preserves, highlighting their natural and cultural significance.

Michael S. Sole, Secretary of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, says, "Florida is known throughout the world for its lush, watery landscapes. *Living Waters* emphasizes the more than two million acres of diverse water landscape and coastal areas that are critical to Florida's future. This award-winning film and exhibit encourage us to be better environmental citizens and gives viewers an intimate look at the unique aquatic preserves of Florida."

Sammy Tedder, a Florida Panhandle music legend, scored the film, weaving sounds of natural instruments he fashioned from

swamp reeds for flutes and cypress logs for percussion. Tedder also will perform at the premier.

The traveling museum exhibit is managed by the Office of Coastal and Aquatic Managed Areas, Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

The exhibit will travel from the GTM Reserve Environmental Education Center in Ponte Verde Beach, FL to Chipola and throughout the South.

The Department of Environmental Protection, National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration, The Ocean Conservancy and The Gulf of Mexico Foundation supported the film's production.

The Artists Guild of Northwest Florida, Inc. and the Fine and Performing Arts Department of Chipola College have joined together to bring this exhibit to the Chipola Arts Center. The exhibit is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. School and civic group visits are encouraged.

## Ivey Brothers to play Endless Summer

Bobby Pierce, head coach of the Troy University Baseball team, is the special guest for Chipola’s Endless Summer Dinner/Dance set for Aug. 23 at the National Guard Armory.

The Marianna native is no stranger to Chipola. He was a star athlete at Marianna high in the late 70’s. Following his graduation as a star outfielder at the University of Alabama in 1982, the then 23-year-old became the youngest head coach in Florida junior college history when he accepted the Chipola head coaching position.

In his first season, Chipola finished 41-15 and won the Florida state championship. Chipola won four Panhandle Conference championships, earned five state tournament berths, with one title, and won 40 or more games four times under Pierce. His squads at Chipola posted a 259-95 overall record.

After the 1989 season, Pierce returned to his alma mater as Alabama’s top assistant coach. After five seasons as an assistant coach, Pierce was named the first head baseball coach in history at the University of Alabama-Huntsville. Pierce posted a 276-108 record in seven seasons.

Pierce has served as head coach of the successful Troy program since 2003. He led the Trojans to the 2006 Sunbelt championship and an NCAA Regional Runner-up finish.

He has compiled a .702 winning percentage in 18 seasons.

Pierce is married to the former Kay Walls of Chipley. The couple has three children - Lance (21), a junior at Troy, Lauren (20), a sophomore at Troy, and Logan (17), a junior in high school.

The Endless Summer event will reunite Chipola friends and alumni for a relaxing evening to benefit the college’s athletic programs.

The Ivey Brothers band will provide the perfect musical backdrop for the occasion. They will be joined by The Villagers, another popular Chipola band from the 1960’s.

Tickets are \$50 per person with a social hour at 6:30 p.m. Tables of eight are available for \$400. Local favorite Bobby Sims will prepare his famous, mouth-watering barbecue for the dinner.

**Christine Yoshikawa, classical pianist**, will perform Tuesday, **March 24.** The Canadian pianist has enjoyed a multi-faceted international career performing as soloist with orchestras, recitalist, chamber musician, and teaching masterclasses throughout North America, Europe, and Asia. Critics have praised her as an artist of “impeccable artistry, radiant lyricism, and virtuosity” for her interpretation of traditional and contemporary repertoire. A prize-winner of national and international competitions, recent concert engagements have taken her to the United Kingdom, Czech Republic, Bulgaria, Spain and France. She holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Arizona State University under the tutelage of Robert Hamilton and is the 2000 Toradze Institute Charter Fellow of Indiana University South Bend. She is on the Roster of Recording Artists for Eroica Classical Recordings and serves on faculty at Chipola College.
