# Chipola Board to consider name change on August 18

Chipola Junior College was established in 1947, but on Aug. 18, the college board of trustees is expected to approve changing the name of the institution to Chipola College.

The change is needed as Chipola prepares to begin offering bachelor's degrees in Secondary Education with majors in Mathematics and Science.

The name change will take place during a special called board meeting at 1 p.m. in the college Arts Center. College officials expect to unveil a banner highlighting the new name.

Chipola made history on June 23 when approval was granted by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) to offer four-year degrees in Secondary Mathematics Education and in Secondary Science Education. Classes will begin in January of 2004.

The news was greeted with shouts of joy from several CJC administrators who have worked on the project since last summer when the Florida Board of Education gave CJC the authority to

offer four-year degrees in response to a critical shortage of math and science teachers in secondary schools.

Dr. Kitty Myers, Associate Vice President of Instructional and Bachelor's Degree Program Development, said, "I'm just ec-

static for the people of this area. I think this will have a long range positive effect on the economy in our community."

Gail Hartzog, Associate Dean of Institutional Development and Planning, said, "CJC currently is accredited at Level I to offer two-year degrees. We applied for permission to make a substantive change from our present status and begin offering four-year degrees." As a Level II institution Chipola is required to make a name change. Chipola College will be

the new name of the institution.

Dr. Sarah Clemmons, Vice President of Instruction and Student Services, said "I'm just so excited to be here during this historic time, and I'm elated that the long process is over. Many people

worked so hard to bring this together. I think it was meant to be."

Hartzog said the college will be notified of any questions or concerns of the SACS committee. Chipola plans to begin offering classes in the program in January 2004. A SACS team will visit CJC in the spring of 2004 to evaluate the program. This evaluation is the next step toward accreditation as a Level II institution.

The 2003-04 state budget includes \$333,000 to help Chipola begin the bachelor's degree programs. CJC president Dr. Gene Prough said, "I am pleased that we will have the funds needed to continue providing quality two year-programs, certificate programs and new four-year degrees for the people in our district."

The change will not affect the college's other programs. Chipola will continue to compete in intercollegiate athletics at the junior college level. Dr. Clemmons

said, "The only changes that our students will notice should be positive ones. Our library already has benefited from additional money for new books and research materials to support the four-year programs."

In 2001, the Florida Legislature earmarked \$3 million in startup funds for community colleges to offer four-year programs. St. Petersburg Community College was granted permission to offer bachelor's degrees in 2001, making it the first community college to take advantage of the four-year opportunity.

The Florida Board of Education in May 2002 adopted a plan to offer four-year degrees in selected disciplines on the campuses of Chipola and Miami-Dade Community Colleges. Chipola was given 30 days to negotiate with Florida State University to decide which school would provide access to baccalaureate degrees in Business Administration, Nursing and Secondary

Education. In June 2002, Education Secretary Jim Horne granted Chipola the authority to offer a bachelor's degree in Secondary Math and Science Education.

FSU proposed offering the Secondary Education program at the FSU Panama City campus. But Horne said he adopted Chipola's proposal in the interest of local students. "The CJC approach was constructed to provide greater program delivery flexibility for community members," Horne said.

Chipola president Dr. Gene Prough said, "We're glad these programs will finally be available in our area. We have a large number of students who cannot move beyond the two-year degree because of work and family circumstances. These programs will provide invaluable opportunities for them."

# Chipola board approves reorganization

The Chipola district board of trustees approved a reorganization of the college administration at the board's regularly monthly meeting on May 20.

Most of the changes relate to Chipola now offering four-year degrees in Secondary Mathematics and Science Education. The college has received approval from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) to begin offering classes in both programs in January of 2004.

Chipola president Dr. Gene Prough said, "We are following a number of recommendations from SACS as we move forward with our program to award bachelor's degrees in education."

**Dr. Sarah Clemmons**, who had served as Dean of Instruction, was named Vice President of Instructional and Student Services replacing Charlton Keen who retires next month.

**Dr. Kitty Myers**, former Director of the University Center, was promoted to Associate Vice President of Instructional and Bachelors Degree Program Development.

Former Comptroller **Steve Young** was promoted to Vice President of Finance re-

placing Ron Ward who retires next month. The Comptroller position was deleted.

**Gail Hartzog** was promoted from Director to Associate Dean of Institutional Development and Planning.

Dr. Rene Tharpe will return to the classroom as a social science instructor. Her former position of Associate Dean of Instruction will be divided between two department director positions. Psychology instructor **Willie Spires** was named Director of Social Science and Business. Math instructor **Dr. Lou Cleveland** was named Director of Math and Natural Science.

**Dr. Jayne Roberts** was promoted to Dean of Enrollment Services from her former position as Counselor/Testing director. The Counselor position was deleted.

The position of Executive Vice President formerly held by Prough was deleted from the organizational chart. A Vice President of Operations was added to the chart but remains unfilled.

Prough said that the filling of any open positions would be subject to legislative funding and a special appropriation he hopes to get for the proposed bachelor's degree programs.

# FACC scholarship program named best in state

Chipola Junior College was presented the Outstanding Scholarship Program Award from the Florida Association of Community Colleges Financial Aid Commission.

CJC counselor Lindsay Roach, who chairs the CJC FACC Scholarship Committee, said, "This award recognizes a very dedicated group of Chipola employees who have volunteered many hours to raise money to endow this scholarship program. We have always felt that this is an exemplary program and we will continue to keep this the best scholarship program in the state."

Chipola's FACC began its fundraising efforts in 1988 and awarded their first \$500 scholarship in the Fall of 1993. That effort has grown tremendously to the current total of \$80,800. During 2002-03 school year FACC awarded more than \$6,375 in tuition scholarships to 10 students and textbook awards for employees.

FACC members raise funds primarily through concession sales at CJC athletic events at which employees volunteer hundreds of hours. FACC members also raise funds through a silent auction of donated items and an annual golf tournament.
