

Faculty performance to open Chipola Artist Series

The Chipola College Artist Series opens Aug. 28 with “A Memorable Musical Soiree,” featuring Chipola’s music faculty.

Resident faculty artists—Dr. Joshua Martin, piano; Tyler Nelson, tenor; Daniel Powell, saxophone; Andrew Stroud, guitar and Dr. Christine Yoshikawa, piano—will delight with their musicianship, skill and



showmanship as they present a memorable evening of music from classical to modern.

Season tickets for the 2007-08 Chipola College Artist Series are on sale through Aug. 29 in the college Fine Arts Building, located behind the Arts Center.

The five-event series also includes: The Caribbean Sound Steel Band’s “An American Carnival” Nov. 13. “An American Carnival” is an exhilarating evening of music, entertainment and fun presenting a fascinating and exciting look at the development of pan, a truly unique innovation of the 20th Century, mixing the sound and culture of the Caribbean through Calypso, Soca, and Latin Music with Classical, American pop and original compositions.

“Pop! Go The Classics” comes to Chipola, Jan. 24. Starring Mac Frampton and the ThreePenny Symphony, “Pop! Go The Classics” showcases celebrated pianist and arranger Mac Frampton in a production that merges his conservatory training with his mastery of the pop and jazz idioms and original interpretations of revered classical works. Frampton has built a library of innovative arrangements based on classical themes in such as works as “Pictures at an Exhibition,” Rachmaninoff’s “Prelude In C# Minor,” “Flight Of The Bumblebee.” Bach, Chopin, and of course, Gershwin are featured in this evening of classical music with a twist of pop.

“Strata” will perform Feb. 19, 2007. Three musicians, three instruments, and one unique sound performing exhilarating Classical and Modern repertoire in trio and duo combinations for violin/viola, clarinet, and piano. All three musicians – Nathan Williams, James Stern, and Audrey Andrist – hold the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Julliard School. The trio performs throughout North America to rave reviews from audiences of all ages.

Proteus 7 will perform March 25, 2008. From Bach to Bacharach, Proteus 7 breathes new life into music with their dynamic, creative and free-ranging approach to styles and repertoire. Members of Proteus 7 perform on Broadway and record for television and motion pictures and have been nominated for Emmy and Grammy awards. All have played with major symphony orchestras throughout the world including the Boston Symphony and Boston Pops, The Cleveland Orchestra, the New York Philharmonic and the Philadelphia Orchestra. Their programs are as diverse as their individual talents, balancing intricate works of Baroque masters in tandem with contemporary classical and jazz counterparts, plus everything in between.

The Chipola Artist Series is funded through Chipola’s Performing Arts Fund, with grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, the Chipola Regional Arts Association and corporate donors.

Chipola Masonry program begins Saturday, Aug. 25

Chipola College’s new Masonry Apprentice Program begins Saturday, August 25.

The program is for anyone interested in the masonry profession. Students may enroll and be sponsored by a licensed masonry contractor or enroll on their own.

Registration will take place the first day of class, Saturday, August 25, at 8 a.m. Classes will be held every other Saturday beginning at 8 a.m. in Building N, Room 111. Signs will be posted directing students to the class.

The program is sponsored by Chipola College and the Florida Masonry Education Foundation and will serve the masonry training and employment needs for the construction industry in the Florida panhandle.

Apprentice students will receive a combination of technical instruction in the classroom and related on-the-job training through employment in the construction field, including:

- Knowledge of the masonry industry
- Use of hand tools
- Selection and mixing of mortars and concrete
- Brick and block laying – both basic and advanced
- Building layout and construction drawings
- Residential and commercial masonry

Metal work, construction techniques and quality control

Repair, estimating, project planning and supervision

Bud Riviere, Chipola dean of Workforce Development, says, “This program will present an excellent training opportunity for a productive career in the masonry industry. Students will benefit from hands-on training and have excellent employment potential with registered masonry contractors.”

Chipola Fall classes begin; registration continues

Fall classes at Chipola College begin Monday, Aug. 20; however late registration will continue through Aug. 24.

State of Florida employees may register Aug. 20-24 using the State Employee Fee Waiver.

Chipola's open-door policy guarantees acceptance to any student with a standard high school diploma. Prospective students should complete a college application which is available in the Office of Admissions and Records, or online at www.chipola.edu. Students also must provide an official high school or college transcript.

Chipola offers day and evening courses, as well as independent study and online courses. The college's Associate in Arts De-



gree provides the first two years of general education courses for students planning to earn a bachelor's degree. Associate in Science Degree programs provide two years of professional training in various career fields.

Chipola also awards Bachelor of Science Degrees in Secondary and Middle School Education with majors in Math and Science. A new Bachelor's of Applied Science degree in Business Management is set to begin in January of 2008.

Chipola is offering a number of Workforce Development programs this fall including: Automotive Technology, Computer Systems Technology, Corrections, Cosmetology, Culinary Management, Electronic Technology, Firefighting, Law Enforcement, Nursing Assistant and Welding. Many workforce programs offer open enrollment which allows students to register at any time during the semester.
