Harris coordinates work orders, pur-

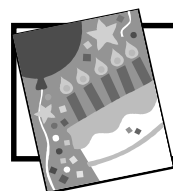

Based in Princeton, New Jersey, The Educational Testing Service is

the world's largest private educational testing and measurement organization and a leader in educational research. The service develops, and annually administers, more than 11 million tests worldwide including the PSAT, GRE, GMAT, AP, and Praxis Series.

In addition to teaching English courses, Culbreth also directs CJC's English tutoring program. She recently developed Chipola's first online course in English composition.

Chipola offers Networking Service degree

Chipola will offer two courses in the newly-revised Networking Service Technology Associate in Science (AS) degree program during the Fall Semester.

Introduction to Microcomputer Maintenance and Repair (CET 1171) is offered Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 8:50 a.m. Introduction to Microcomputer Use (CGS 1060) is offered at six times. Other general education courses required for The Networking Service degree are also offered this semester. Classes begin Aug. 21. Late registration will continue through Aug. 27.

The Networking degree focuses on computer systems and network support. Courses cover a broad set of skills and knowledge in computer net-

work administration. Courses emphasize objectives as outlined in recognized industry certification including the A+ and Network+ certifications, as well as the core courses for the MCSE, Microsoft Certified Systems Engineer.

The purpose of this two-year program is to prepare students for employment as information technology specialists, network control operators, data analysts, network technicians, computer security specialists, network specialists, network managers, microcomputer technicians, troubleshooters, WAN/LAN managers, or systems administrators.

Some 18 students made perfect averages of 4.0—straight A's. These students and their hometowns are:

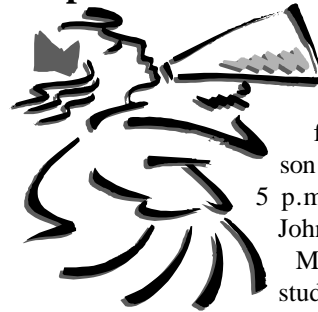

encouraged to try out. Applicants must have a 2.0 GPA and be full-time CJC students in Fall 2001.

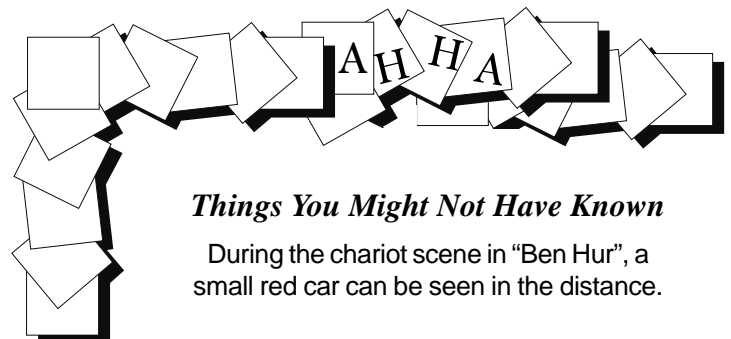
