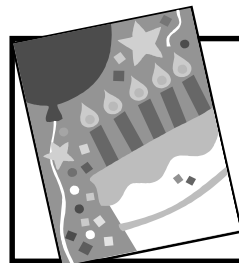

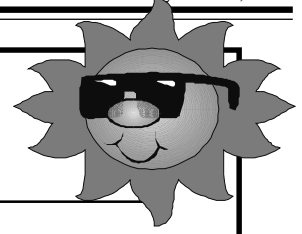

University Center @ Chipola offers degrees close to home

The University Center @ Chipola offers bachelor's and advanced degree programs on the CJC campus. All University Center programs are administered by university personnel. Degrees earned are the same as those awarded to students who attend classes on the home campus.

The University of West Florida offers several programs. Full-time UWF faculty are housed at CJC. A **Special/Elementary Education, BA** is offered mostly in the evenings. Registration deadline is the week of Aug. 21. Contact Patricia Davis at 718-2361. UWF also offers a **Criminal Justice, BA** through evening classes. Registration deadline is the week of Aug. 21. Contact April Robinson at 718-2361. **Interdisciplinary Information Technology, BS** is an e-Learning Support track which offers web-based courses with periodic visits from faculty. Registration deadline is the week of August 21. Contact Dr. Kitty Myers at 718-2260. **Masters in Educational Leadership with Administrative Certification, Educational Specialist and Educational Doctorate in Curriculum and Instruction** is offered evenings and weekends. Florida A & M University offers Bachelor's and Master's degrees in **Social Work**. Most courses are offered in the evening. Registration deadline is Aug. 15. For information, contact Dr. Kitty Myers at 718-2260.

Florida State University offers a **Bachelor's degree in Nursing**. FSU has a full-time advisor/recruiter at CJC. Most classes are Web-based. An FSU representative will provide computer orientation. 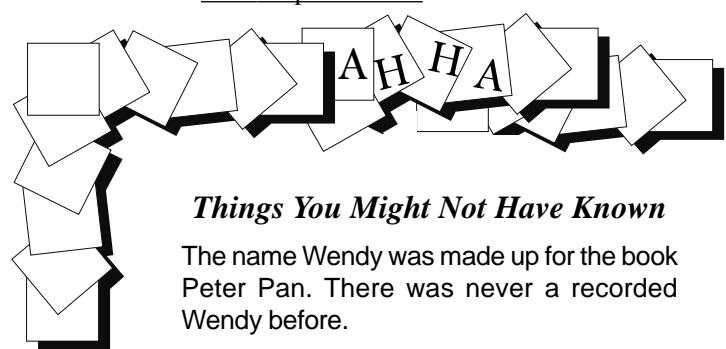
FSU also offers several degree programs through the 2+2 initiative. These programs use Web-based instruction, and local mentors to assist students. Programs include: **BS in Computer Science, Software Engineering, Information Studies and Interdisciplinary Social Science**. Financial Aid for University Center students is available through each university. Students who must take prerequisite courses concurrently from Chipola may receive aid through a consortium agreement.. Students who cannot find aid to pay for prerequisite courses, may apply for funds from the Chipola Foundation's Beall Endowment Fund. Applications for Beall funds will be accepted Aug. 1 - 31.
