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Encephalitis expert to speak at Chipola

Dr. William Jeter will present a public seminar on Eastern Equine Encephalitis and the West Nile Virus, **Tuesday, Sept. 18, at 7 p.m. in Jackson Hall of the Literature/Language Building** on the campus of Chipola Junior College.

Jeter addressed a large group of Chipola students on Sept. 12, but a public seminar originally scheduled for Sept. 11 was cancelled due the closing of the college.

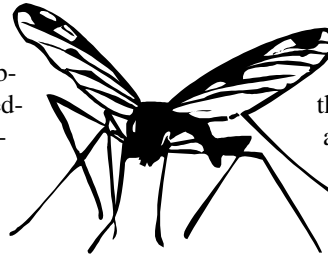
Dr. Jeter is the Diagnostic Veterinary Manager of Equine Programs in the Division of Animal Industry of the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. He has been actively involved with several livestock disease control and eradication programs, enforcement of interstate regula-

tions for movement of livestock and supervision of field program activities.

Jeter also is a member of Florida's Surveillance and Response Team that monitors Encephalitis outbreaks in Florida. His presentation "Mosquito-Borne Encephalitis in Humans and Horses" will include: the basic morphology and life cycle of these viruses; clinical diagnosis and symptoms; types of various mosquitoes; reservoir hosts and final hosts; vaccinations; prevention and control; geographic distribution and incidence; and mortality.

The public is encouraged to attend the meeting.

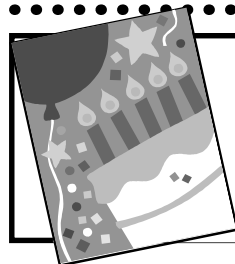

The Chipola-I/Tech partnership includes: Microsoft Certified Systems Engineer (MCSE) Windows 2000 certification program, A+ Certified Computer Technician Program and Network+.

Microsoft (MCSE) certification is a professional credential for aspiring IT professionals who are qualified to analyze the business requirements for system architecture, deploy, install, and configure infrastructure components, and troubleshoot system problems.

The A+ Certified Computer Technician Program, sponsored by the Computing Technology Industry Association (CompTIA), certifies the competency of service technicians in the computer industry. Students learn to upgrade, repair and troubleshoot PCs and much more.

A **20-Hour Childcare Training** course will



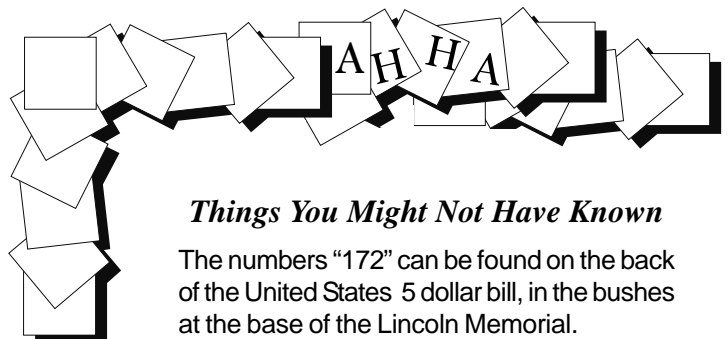
