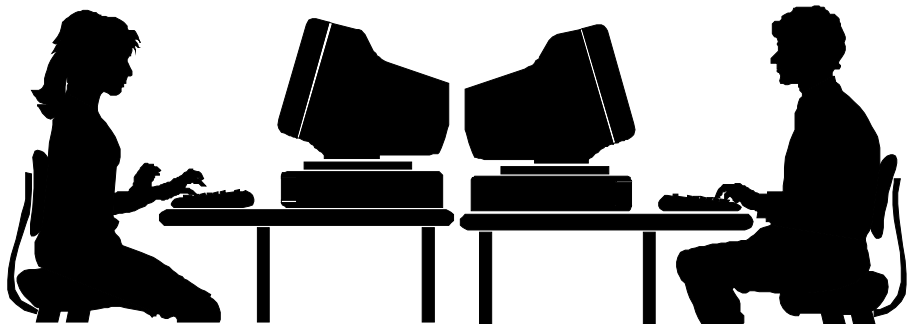

Chipola enrollment up this fall

Enrollment at Chipola Junior College is up this Fall by nearly four percent over last year.

Exactly 3.72 percent more students registered during Fall 2001 compared to the same period for Fall 2000. Total headcount is up to 1,728 total students compared to 1,665 last Fall.

CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel says, "I believe this positive trend indicates that we have been sensitive to the needs of our students. We have attempted to offer more classes at convenient times, and we have expanded our dual-enrollment and distance-learning programs. The success of our Foundation is also a key ingredient in this increase. The generosity of our supporters has made a college education accessible to everyone."

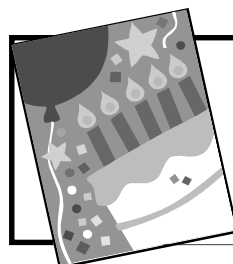
O'Daniel also reports that the presence of the University Center @ Chipola

has positively affected enrollment since students must take freshman and sophomore level pre-requisites at CJC to qualify for some four-year programs. An estimated 250 students are currently enrolled in university programs offered on the CJC campus.

While CJC has more students this Fall, another figure indicates students are taking slightly fewer classes. Full-time Equivalency (FTE), an average calculation of the number of hours students take, dipped 1.12 percent, down from 447.8 last year to 442.78 this year.

Though academic classes are well underway, students may continue to register for many of Chipola's Workforce Development programs and Continuing Education courses throughout the semester.

**Atlanta Symphony Brass Quintet plays Chipola Sept 6**

Marianna businessman Ronnie Myers will serve as narrator for the one-act opera, "Hornsmoke," which will be presented by the **Atlanta Symphony Brass Quintet**, as part of their concert Thursday, Sept. 6, at 7 p.m. in the Chipola Junior College Theater.

Myers is a former CJC basketball player who is well known for his unique voice and lively sense of humor. The Atlanta group picks a local celebrity at every venue to narrate "Hornsmoke."

Set in the Old West town of Spitvalve, the one-act opera is staged complete with The Only Saloon, cactus and a sunset for cowboy's exit. **Myers** will serve as narrator for characters Blazing Bill Foghorn, his daughter Coranetta, and B-Flat Bart. The last scene, Showdown and Finale, features the notorious "Hornslinger," who, disguised as B-Flat Bart, the bad guy with the black hat, totes a horn on his side for a weapon and carries ammunition (mouthpieces) in his gunbelt.

The Atlanta Symphony Brass Quintet concert is the first offering in the Chipola Artist Series. It includes principal players of the internationally

acclaimed Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. Their repertoire spans four centuries, from the Renaissance and Baroque through works commissioned especially for the Atlanta Symphony Brass Quintet.

The Quintet began 29 years ago as the "Ceremonial Troupe" of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, having performed for numerous dignitaries including Prince Charles. The group has appeared on National Public Radio's Performance Today, and last summer was the "house band" for four days of live radio broadcast over NPR to 40 countries.

Tickets—\$12 for adults, \$8 for ages 18 and under, and \$4 for CJC students with current ID—are on sale at the CJC Chipola Business Office. A limited number of tickets may be available at the door, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Three other offerings are slated for the Artist Series:

Simon & Son, Nov. 5, America's only father/son piano duo; **Alborada, Jan. 9**, a program of Andean folk music; and **Common Ground, Feb. 7**, a dance program featuring Irish step-dancers, country cloggers and American tap-dancers. Season tickets—\$40—are available for all four events.

CJC Workforce programs have openings

Fall classes at Chipola Junior College began Aug. 21, but registration is still underway for a number of Workforce Development programs.

Most programs feature open enrollment, which allows students to enroll at any time and complete programs at their own pace. All programs offer excellent job placement potential. Financial aid is available, and remedial assistance is provided for most programs.

Certificate Programs include: Accounting Applications, Applied Welding Technologies, Automotive Service Technology, Commercial Food and Culinary Arts, Correctional Officer, Computer Electronics Technology, Electronics Technology, Emergency Medical Technician, Grooming & Salon Services (formerly Cosmetology), Law Enforcement, Combination Law Enforcement & Corrections, Office Specialist and Telecommunications.

Associate in Science Degree Programs include: Business Administration & Management,



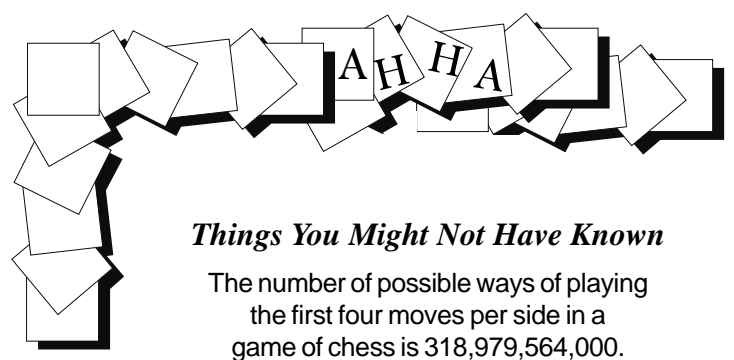
