Former CJC baseballer turns pro

Former Chipola baseball player Justin Lord of Marianna recently signed a professional contract with the Kansas City Royals.

Lord, a 6'4, 210 pound, right-handed pitcher, was picked up after just two weeks in the Cape Cod League, a wooden bat league for college players in Hiannas, Mass. On July 3, he began Short Season A Ball, a league for players who have just finished college. The not-so-short 75-game season runs through Sept. 5.

Lord said he hopes to be invited to play in the Instructional League that would mean a six-week stay in Haynes City, Fla., in November. Following the winter break, the Royals would tell him where to report in the spring. Those destinations include: A League in Burlington, Iowa and Wilmington, Delaware; AA League in Wichita KS, or AAA League in Omaha, Nebraska. Omaha is the site of the College World Series and for Lord would be the step before the majors.

Of his first day as a pro Lord says, "It is a very different experience. I'm 2000 miles from Marianna and I don't know a soul here. I just thank God for giving me the opportunity to play. It's a dream come true. I'm one step closer to my ultimate dream of playing in the major leagues." Lord could play for some of his largest

crowds ever, with attendance averaging 5,000 a night.

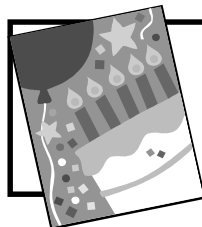
Lord recently completed his junior year at Florida State where he logged 11 saves as a closer. He recorded a 2-3 record and 3.2 ERA during the 2000-01 season. "I hated to leave FSU. The year I spent there was great. FSU is one of the top programs in the country. It was fun and exciting and I thank the coaches for giving me the chance to pitch for the Seminoles. They had a lot of confidence in me and I appreciate all of them." His contract with



the Royals includes money to finish his college degree that he plans to complete during Fall breaks from baseball.

Lord had an outstanding pitching career at Chipola. He logged 90 strikeouts in 88 innings during his sophomore season, chalking up a 6-6 record a 2.6 ERA. Lord says the Chipola program prepared him for Divison 1. "It was great experience playing for Coach Johnson and my teammates. I couldn't have asked for a better bunch of guys. I learned and matured at Chipola. I think junior college builds character in baseball and life. Coach Johnson did a great job of preparing me for what I was going to face ahead."

Lord is the son of Buddy and Joy Lord of Marianna.

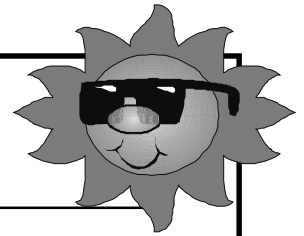
UF TRANSFERS

Applicants must be at least 19 years of age,

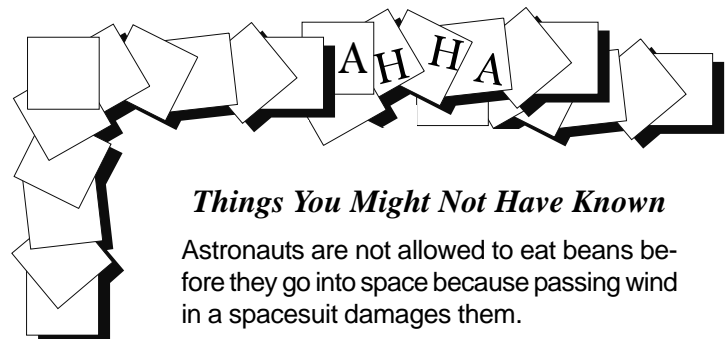
