Prepare now for Spring Registration at Chipola

Registration for the Spring Semester at Chipola College is Jan. 4 for returning students and Jan. 5 for new students. Classes begin Jan. 6.

Chipola's open-door policy allows any student with a high school diploma to enroll after completing an application and providing high school or college transcripts.

Chipola offers college credit courses during the day and evening, and also online and through independent study. The college awards the Associate in Arts (AA) degree which guarantees acceptance to Florida's public universities. Chipola's also offers Bachelor's degree programs in Secondary Education with majors in Mathematics or Science.



Chipola also offers several Associate in Science (AS) programs, as well as a number of Workforce Development programs which provide training for high wage jobs.

Chipola's University Center provides opportunities for students to pursue a number of bachelor's and graduate degrees from FSU, UF, Troy State and UWF on the Chipola campus. The University of Florida is Chipola's latest University Center partner. UF will offer Animal Science courses on the Chipola campus beginning in January.

New computer courses set at Chipola

The Business and Technology Department at Chipola College has added the following Computer Science classes to the Spring 2005 schedule: COP 2000 Introduction to Computer Programming 12:00 – 12:50 (MWR) and COP 2444 C++ Programming 1:00-1:50 (MWR).

COP 2000 is the first programming course for students in Computer Science, Engineering, Information Systems, and related fields. Students must complete COP 2000 before registering for COP 2224. It is expected that COP 2224 will be offered only during the Fall 2005 semester, therefore students needing that course during the 2005-06 academic year should complete COP 2000 during Spring 2005.

Lady Indians host Ramada Limited Winter Showcase

The Chipola Lady Indians host the Ramada Limited Winter Showcase Dec. 16-18 in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center.

Showcase action opens at 3 p.m., Thursday, when Tallahassee takes on Three Rivers CC. Wallace State plays Mott CC in the 5 p.m. game. Chipola faces off with St. Catharine's in the 7 p.m. game on Thursday.

Friday's lineup begins with Mott and St. Catharine's at 3 p.m. Tallahassee and Wallace square off at 5 p.m. Chipola hosts Three Rivers in the 7 p.m. nightcap.

Saturdays' games include Three Rivers and St. Catharine's at noon. Tallahassee plays Mott at 2 p.m. Chipola plays Wallace at 4 p.m. on Saturday.

The Lady Indians continued their perfect 8-0 run with a pair of big wins at the Langston Classic in Port St. Joe, Nov. 26-27. Chipola scored an incredible 101-27 win over Lawson State on Nov. 26. Michelle Stocks led Chipola with 18 points. Monica King scored 16. Ashley Perry had 14. Chinata Nesbit scored 11 and Cherish Tom added 10.

Chipola scored a solid 72-58 win over Palm Beach on Nov. 27 in the Langston Classic. Nesbit led Chipola with 20 points. Stocks scored 14. Perry scored 13.

The Chipola women travel to the Central Florida Classic, Dec. 11-12 to play Cen-

tral Florida and Darton before returning home to host the Winter Showcase.

The Chipola Indians are 11-1 following a pair of wins in the Microtel Panhandle Classic. Chipola entered the tournament ranked 12th in the NJCAA Poll. The Indians whipped eighth-ranked Georgia Perimeter 90-74 behind the scoring of Mario Boggan with 27 points and nine rebounds.

Chipola scored a decisive 74-59 win over Middle Georgia on Dec. 4. Boggan

lead in scoring with 25 points and 15 rebounds. Stefhon Hannah scored 13. Brent Crews had 12. Michael Taylor scored 11 points and pulled in seven rebounds

The Indians have won nine straight contests pushing their

overall record to 11-1. Chipola scored a pair of convincing wins in the Langston Classic in Port St. Joe, Nov. 26-27. The Indians trounced Lawson State, 100-47, on Nov. 26. The Indians outlasted Alabama Southern 82-72 on Nov. 27. Boggan led Chipola with 42 points and 14 rebounds.

The Indians are on the road Dec. 17-18 at the Florida JUCO Shootout in Gainesville. Chipola faces St. Petersburg and Seminole.

The courses apply to a bachelor's degree in Animal Science and a pre-veterinary curriculum. Introduction to Animal Science (ANS 3006C) will be offered on the Chipola campus, Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 2 to 5 p.m. Personal Computer Use in Agriculture (ALS 3203) and Agroforestry in the Southeastern U.S. (FOR 3855) will be offered online.

TAX TIP - SALES TAX DEDUCTION. Taxpayers who itemize deductions will have the choice of claiming a state and local tax deduction for either sales or income taxes on their 2004 and 2005 income tax returns. The State of Florida has no income tax, therefore, the residents of Florida will be able to take the sales tax deduction on their return. To determine the amount of sales tax that can be deducted the taxpayer may keep their receipts or take an amount outlined in tables provided by the Internal Revenue Service. The tables are optional but will allow the taxpayer to select the appropriate deduction based upon filing status, number of dependents, adjusted gross income and rates of state and local general sales taxation. Sales tax paid on motor vehicles and boats may be added to the table amount, but only up to the amount paid at the general sales tax rate.
