Chipola library part of new online reference service

Chipola College Library joined Florida's Secretary of State Glenda Hood and nearly 60 other libraries from across the state to usher in the future of online library reference services in Florida: 'Ask a Librarian.'

Through 'Ask a Librarian,' staff at libraries across the state offer Florida's 16 million residents free, live, one-on-one reference assistance over the Web. Librarians can answer reference questions, help locate and use information on the Internet, and provide expert advice on using electronic information. Easy-to-use chat and co-browsing software allows the librarian and information seeker to navigate the Internet together while viewing the same Web pages.

The librarian may help a student use online databases to conduct research, assist a consumer with safety information about her car, or point an elderly citizen towards health care information—all in a real-time, interactive, virtual environment.

Because 'Ask a Librarian' is Web-based, it doesn't matter where in Florida the user is located. An information seeker in Marianna, for example, can simply log onto the service at www.askalibrarian.org to receive assistance from a librarian staffing the service from one of nearly 60 participating libraries across the state.

E-Filing tax service offered by students

Chipola accounting instructor, Lee Shook and the Chipola accounting students are offering free electronic filing beginning in January for all Chipola students.

Students may take a tax deduction of up to \$3,000 for 2003 college or post-secondary tuition and fees for a taxpayer, spouse or dependent. But only taxpayers with incomes of up to \$65,000 for single filers or \$130,000 for couples filing jointly can claim the deduction.

The Hope tax credit allows taxpayers to claim up to \$1,500 for tuition and related expenses. But the credit can be taken only for students in their first two years of college or other post-secondary education. A student must have been enrolled in a degree or certificate program for at least one academic period beginning in 2003 and must have carried at least half of what the school considers a normal academic workload.

The Lifetime Learning credit can be taken at a rate of 20 percent of the first \$10, 000 of qualified expenses, up to a maximum credit of \$2,000 per tax return for 2003. There is no limit on the number of years this credit may be taken, and there is no enrollment requirement for the Lifetime Learning credit - it may be claimed for a single course.
