The Chipola Indians host the Fibercare Baseball Classic, Feb. 17-19, at the Chipola field.

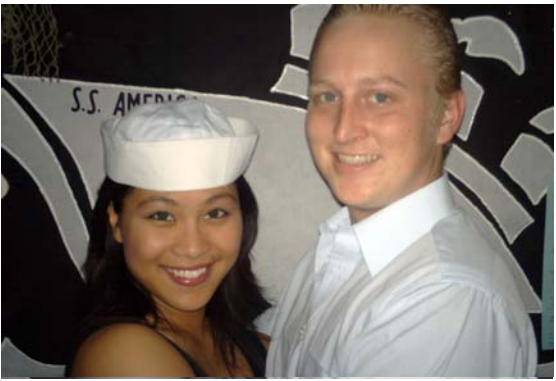

## Chipola teams tied for first in Panhandle Conference

The Chipola Indians moved into a tie for first in the Panhandle Conference after upsetting top-ranked Okaloosa-Walton on Tuesday, Feb. 8.



Chipola trounced OW, 68-48, before a packed house in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center. Four Indians scored in double figures. Kendaris Pelton had 14 points and 7 rebounds. Stefhon Hannah scored 12 points and pulled in 5 rebounds. Mario Boggan had 12 points and 5 rebounds. Michael Taylor also 12 points and 5 rebounds. The Indians forced 25 turnovers. Though the Indians shot only 39 percent from the field, they were 10 of 10 from the free throw line.

Chipola improved to 6-1 in the league and 23-2 overall. The Indians' only conference loss was at OW on Jan. 22. The men's conference standings as of Feb. 10, are: Chipola (6-1); OW (6-1); TCC (3-4); GCC (3-4) and PJC (0-8).

Chipola hits the road for games at Tallahassee, Feb. 12 and at Gulf Coast, Feb. 19.

The Indians' next home game is Monday, Feb. 21, against Pensacola.

The top two teams in the conference earn a berth in the state tournament, set for March 9-12, at Chipola.

The Indians are currently ranked third in the state JUCO poll behind OW and Santa Fe. The next poll comes out Monday, Feb. 14.

### Lady Indians

The Chipola Lady Indians are tied with Gulf Coast for first place in the Pan-

handle Conference.

Chipola defeated Okaloosa-Walton, 54-51, on Tuesday, behind the scoring of Elaine McCants with 19 points. Tayani Clark scored 10 points on the night. Tamika Jackson added 10 rebounds.

The Lady Indians improved to 7-2 in the league and 20-4 overall. The women's league standings as of Feb. 10, are: Chipola (7-2); Gulf Coast (7-2); PJC (5-3); OW is (4-5); TCC is (3-5); and NFL is (0-9). The top two teams in the women's league earn a spot in the state tournament.

Chipola soundly defeated Pensacola, 61-49, on Feb. 5. Chinata Nesbit and Nacole Stocks scored 15 points apiece. Elaine McCants had 11.

Nacole Stocks was named FCCAA Player of the week for her performance in Chipola's wins over Gulf Coast and PJC. She logged 10 points, 4 rebounds, 5 steals in the Lady Indians' big 62-40 upset over the top-ranked Lady Commodores of Gulf Coast on Feb. 1.

The Chipola win marked Gulf Coast's first Panhandle Conference loss since February of 2000.

Chipola ended Gulf Coast's 66-game conference win streak with a balanced scoring attack. Three Lady Indians scored double figures. Tojalynn Atmore led with 11. Stocks and Tamika Jackson scored 10 apiece. Gulf Coast slipped to 7-2 in the league with loss to PJC on Feb. 9

Chipola women hit the road for games at Tallahassee, Feb. 12, North Florida, Feb. 16 and at Gulf Coast, Feb. 19. The Lady Indians' next home game is Monday, Feb. 21, against Pensacola.

## Chipola celebrates Career and Technical Education Week

Students and faculty in the 40 career and technical education programs at Chipola College will celebrate National Career and Technical Education week February 13-19.

The theme of this year's celebration is "Career Tech: Training Tomorrow's Workforce." Special activities are scheduled to emphasize the role that career tech education and its business/industry partners play in helping youths and adults achieve career success.

"We hope to continue to emphasize the importance of the high-wage/high-tech workforce programs offered at Chipola. Our programs are state-of-the-art with excellent employment opportunities," said Bud Riviere, Dean of Workforce Development. According to research from the Association for Career and Technical Education, many of the country's fastest-growing occupations require the technical skills taught in career tech education programs. Research also shows that among high school graduates entering the workforce, those

with a technical education background earn more than those without this advantage.

Most of Chipola's workforce programs feature open enrollment, which allows students to enroll at any time and complete programs at their own pace. Several programs have reached capacity for the semester, but have established waiting lists.
