## Chipola men ranked #1 in state poll, women ranked #4

One game past the halfway mark through the Panhandle Conference race, the Indians lead the league at 6-1. The top two men's teams earn a berth in the state tournament, March 3-6, at Chipola. Second place is wide open at this point with three teams knotted at 3-4 and one at 3-5.

The Indians improved to 6-1 and 22-3 overall with a 71-62 win at OW on Wednesday, Feb. 4. Deke Thompson led the Indians' balanced attack with 17 points, including three, three pointers. Je'kel Foster logged 15 points, four assists and a pair of steals on the night. Va'Shaun Newborne turned in 13 points, seven rebounds and two steals. Mario Jointer also had 10 points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals.

Chipola scored a big 90-63 victory over Pensacola on Jan. 31. Je'kel Foster had 18 points in the game.

Foster was named FCCAA men's player of the week for Feb. 2. He chalked up 42 points, 13 rebounds, 9 assists, 11 steals in Chipola's recent wins over Pensacola and Gulf Coast. He leads the state in free throw percentage at 83 percent. He has hit 83 of 99 attempts from the line. Foster is also fifth in the state in assists with 5.8 per game.

The men's league standings as of Feb. 5 are: Chipola (6-1), GCCC (3-4), OW (3-4), TCC (3-4), and PJC (3-5).

## Chipola's first B.S. classes plant tree

The Indians have been ranked first in the State JUCO Poll for the three consecutive weeks and 12<sup>th</sup> in the NJCAA poll, the only Florida team on the national list.

**The Lady Indians** defeated OW 61-49 on Wednesday to take a strong hold on second place in the league. The top three teams in the women's league earn a berth to the state tournament. Melissa Killings led Chipola with 15. Reggie Maddox, Andrea Martin and Ashley Perry each scored 10.

Chipola is 7-3 in the conference and 21-4 overall. Pensacola (4-4) is the next closest team in third.

Chipola defeated Pensacola 49-47 on Jan. 31 with a last second shot by Tamika Jackson. Leading scorers were Martin with 15 and Kristina Andjelkovic with 9.

The Lady Indians are currently ranked fourth in the state after several weeks in the number three spot. The team is ranked eighth in the national poll. Reggie Maddox is number 12 on the state scoring list, averaging 14.7 points per game.

Chipola scored a big 59-48 win over Tallahassee on Jan. 20. The win was the Lady Indians' first-ever road victory at TCC.

The women's conference standings as of Feb. 5, are: GCCC (9-0), Chipola (7-3), PJC (4-4), TCC (3-5) OW (3-6), and NFL (0-8).

## State Tourney set for March 3-6

More than 2,000 visitors are expected to converge on Marianna March 3-6, when Chipola College hosts the Florida Junior College Men's and Women's State Basketball Tournament. The top men's and women's teams in the state will compete in 14 exciting games. Sixteen teams, with coaches, cheerleaders and hundreds of fans will visit Jackson County and contribute an estimated \$250,000 to the local economy.

The Jackson County Tourist Development Council has awarded a grant in the amount of \$10,000 to assist in hosting the tournament.

Dozens of key supporters are working with the Appreciation Club to sell advance tickets. Tournament passes—\$25 for adults and \$15 for students—will get fans into all 14 exciting tournament games. Single session tickets are \$10 each.

## Cleveland is Faculty/Administrator of the Month



Dr. Lou Cleveland, has been selected Chipola College's Faculty/Administrator of the month for February.

Cleveland presently serves as director of math, science and education. She began as the Mathematics Coordinator at Chipola in 1983 and has taught every course in the Mathematics department. She developed an online course in Introduction to Educational Technology course and for the CLAST review. Currently she is teaching some of the first courses in Chipola's new Bachelor Degree program in secondary mathematics.

Cleveland attended Chipola, and earned B.S., M.S., Specialist and Doctoral degrees from Florida State University. She has served on numerous college committees including Theatre, FACC Scholarship, Curriculum and SACS. She is a member of the Council of Chipola Educators (CCE) and The Florida Association of Community Colleges (FACC). She has been in several of Chipola's play productions and has sung in faculty and student recitals and with the Chipola chorus. She wrote the mathematics section of a textbook used in CLAST courses throughout the State of Florida.

The colleague who nominated her for the award said, "Dr. Cleveland is dedicated

to her students and toward the good of the student body. She keeps the welfare of the students as her top priority. She is truly one of the strongest assets of Chipola College."

Cleveland's many academic honors include: Chipola's Kirkland Award for Excellence in Teaching; FACC Professor of the Year, FACC Curriculum and Instruction Award: State Winner 1988, Regional Winner 1992; Dean's Award of Merit, Association of Community College Trustees' Southeast Region Teaching Award; State Finalist for Outstanding Programs in Mathematics and Science; National College Teaching, Learning and Technology Award for Innovative Excellence in Teaching, Learning and Technology Award; Florida Two-Year College Mathematics Association Statewide Teaching Award, 1998; Florida Nominee for the American Association of Two Year College Teaching Award, 1999.

Cleveland and her husband Al, a Chipola alumnus, have two grown children, Emily and Colby, who also graduated from Chipola. Colby is a civil engineer with the Florida Department of Education and Emily is a graduate student in the Pharmacy Doctoral program at the University of Florida. The family is active in the First Baptist Church of Chipley.

The faculty/administrator award includes a plaque, reserved parking for a month, a \$300 bonus, and a \$50 gift certificate from the College Book Store. Monthly winners are eligible for the annual award.
