CJC student learns in Americorps program

Chipola sophomore Jonathan Basford is one of the first CJC students ever to participate in the Federal Americorps program.

During most of 2002, Basford worked as a tour guide and biologist's assistant in the Florida Caverns State Park.

Basford, who played the lead roles in Chipola's "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat," "Charlie Brown" and "Footloose," served as a guide on special tours of the Caverns on weekends and evenings. He was able to put his acting skills to good use when he donned the period uniforms of the Civilian Conservation Corps workers who discovered the caves in the 1920's.

His other work at the park included clearing trails and assisting biologist Mark Ludlow in exotic plant eradication and working with assistant park manager Brian Fugate.

Basford, who had never toured the caves prior to his Americorps job, said he especially enjoyed meeting new people and learning about the state park system.

The Indians suffered a narrow 70-69 loss to Tallahassee on Tuesday, Feb. 11. Chipola's Walker Russell had a shot at the buzzer, but it bounced off the rim, to give TCC its first win over Chipola this season. Chipola trailed 37-35 at the half. Nick Williams led Chipola with 19. Tom Frericks scored 17. Brandon Freeman had 13. JueMichael Young added 8.

Chipola is currently tied for first place with OW, both with 7-2 records as of Feb. 13. Tallahassee is a game out at 6-3. Pensacola is 1-7 and Gulf Coast is 1-8. CJC head coach Ryan Cross said, "This is a very

unforgiving league. There is no room for error or injury in this conference. There are three really good teams in this league, but even the two teams at the bottom are solid and capable of winning."
