## Both Chipola teams make state tournament

Both Chipola Junior College basketball teams will play in the State JUCO Tournament set for March 5-8 in Chipola's Johnson Health Center.

The 9-3 Indians finished the regular season at second in the league with a 22-8 overall mark.

Chipola scored a 94-84 win at Gulf Coast on Saturday. CJC head coach Ryan Cross said, "It was a pretty good effort. We were up double figures most of the game and we pretty much controlled the game throughout."

Brandon Freeman paced Chipola with a career-high 41 points including nine three-pointers. Walter Harris and Michael Wilds scored 10 apiece.

Chipola is tentatively scheduled to play Broward in the first round of the tournament on March 6. The Indians fell to Broward earlier in the season in Ocala. OW (10-2) will represent the Panhandle as the first place team.

The Lady Indians (7-8) also earned a tournament berth with a third place finish in the league. CJC finished the season 17-13 with a 90-57 loss at top-ranked Gulf Coast. But the game was of no consequence to the Lady Indians as PJC beat TCC to give Chipola one game up on TCC.

Head coach Jason Keene said, "We went into the game short-handed. Rebecca Montz has two broken fingers and Heidi Fowler has a knee injury." Only seven Lady Indians dressed out for the game. Lanita Carter led Chipola with 17. Melissa Killings of Bonifay had 12.

The Lady Indians will likely play Miami Dade in the first round of the state tournament on Wednesday, March 5.

The state tournament begins Wednesday, March 5 with women's first round games. Men's first round games are Thursday, March 6, with games. Men and women play second round games on Friday, March 7. Games are scheduled at 1, 3, 6 and 8 p.m. on Wednesday, Thursday

and Friday. The championship games are set for 5 and 7 p.m. on Saturday, March 8.

Tournament passes—\$25 for adults and \$15 for students—will get fans into all 14 exciting tournament games. Single session tickets are \$10 each.

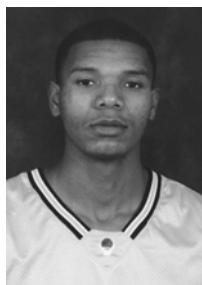

## Former CJC player is WAC Player of the Week



Louisiana Tech guard and former Chipola player Lavelle Felton was recently named the Western Athletic Conference men's basketball player of the week for February 10-16.

Felton, a senior from Milwaukee, Wis.,

made 72.7 percent of his shots from the field (24-33) and averaged 20.3 points and 7.3 rebounds in three victories for Louisiana Tech last week. He began the week with 19 points, seven rebounds, five assists and three steals in a home win against Tulsa last Monday.

On Thursday, he scored 19 points and grabbed six rebounds in helping Louisiana Tech snap Fresno State's 12-game home

winning streak. Felton then scored 23 points in a 99-97 overtime win at Nevada that broke the Wolf Pack's 10-game home winning streak. He also shot 10-of-15 from three-point range for the week and played all 40 minutes against both Tulsa and Fresno State.

It was Felton's first ever WAC player of the week award and second straight for a Bulldog this year.
