Chipola hoops squads in thick of conference race

Chipola hosts Okaloosa-Walton in a pair of big conference match-ups Tuesday, Jan. 30, in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center. Both Chipola teams travel to Pensacola on Saturday, Jan. 27.

The Indians moved to second place in the state FCCAA poll following a 97-92 double overtime loss to top-ranked Tallahassee before a packed house at Chipola on Jan. 20. Jamarcus Ellis led the Indians with 20 points, 13 rebounds, 4 assists, and 3 steals. DeAndre Thomas had 20 points and 6 rebounds. Victor Dubovitsky had 15 points and 8 rebounds. Mario Little added 10 points. The game was Chipola's first misfire of the season.

Chipola improved to 21-1 with a convincing 77-57 rout of Gulf Coast on Jan. 23.

Michael Vogler led the Indians with 13 points, 4 rebounds and 5 steals. Jamarcus Ellis had 12 points, 2 rebounds and 6 assists. DeAndre Thomas had 11 points and 7 rebounds. Victor Dubovitsky had 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Chipola (4-1) is in second place in Panhandle Conference behind Tallahassee (5-0). Okaloosa-Walton (2-2) is third in the league followed by Pensacola (1-4) and Gulf Coast (0-5). The Indians are third in the NJCAA National Poll. OW is ranked sixth and TCC is number 13.

The Indians scored a hard-fought 76-74 win at Okaloosa-Walton on Jan. 17. Jamarcus Ellis led Chipola with 26 points and

6 rebounds.

The Lady Indians improved to 4-2 in league play with a big 66-49 win over Gulf Coast on Jan. 23. CJ Pace led Chipola with 18 points. Lesheria Stevens had 16. Crystal Campbell scored 11 points and RaShawna Sippio added 10.

The Lady Indians scored an important 65-48 win over Tallahassee on Jan. 20. Sippio led Chipola with 13 points. Gekeela Clemmons had 11. Latoya Brown added 10.

Chipola suffered a 62-55 loss at Okaloosa Walton on Jan. 17. Sippio led with 22 points. Clemmons had 13.

Chipola is knotted in a three-way tie for second place in the women's conference with Gulf Coast and TCC, all at 4-2. OW leads the league with a 5-1 mark. The top three teams in the Panhandle Conference earn a berth to the state tournament.

The Panhandle Conference holds the top four spots in the FCCAA State Women's Poll this week. Gulf Coast remains first, followed by Chipola in second, OW in third and Tallahassee in fourth place.

Chipola men's and women's basketball games are broadcast by Deep South Sports on WJAQ (100.9). Games scheduled for Jan. 23, 30 and Feb. 21 will be broadcast on WTOT (101.7)

Professional speaker Craig MacFarlane to speak at Chipola

The public is invited to hear motivational speaker Craig MacFarlane Tuesday, Jan. 30, at 10 a.m., in Jackson Hall on the Chipola College campus.

MacFarlane joined Edward Jones, Inc., in 1991 as a motivational speaker and goodwill ambassador. Blind since age 2, the accomplished athlete speaks across the continent in communities in which Edward Jones has offices.

During his athletic career, MacFarlane earned national championships in blind competitions that include wrestling, water skiing, track and field, and downhill skiing.

Since age 2, he has used his other senses to "see" the world around him. At age 6, while attending a national school for the blind, MacFarlane began wrestling. He won his first blind national wrestling championship at age 13. In 1976 and 1980, he was the youngest member of Canada's blind Olympic wrestling team.

In 1984, MacFarlane was selected to be part of the Reagan-Bush team of campaign speakers and spoke that year at the Republican National Convention. He has spoken at three RNC Conventions and has been profiled by Bob Costas.

In addition to his athletic accomplishments, MacFarlane has passed the Series 7 and Series 63 securities licensing exams. He has recorded an album and written a book about his life, titled "Inner Vision."

MacFarlane attended Carleton University in Ottawa, Canada, where he studied law and political science.
