Dinner planned to honor W. A. Woodham



Long-time Gadsden County Sheriff W. A. Woodham, who died in April of this year, will be remembered at a dinner and dance celebrating his life on Friday evening, Aug. 26, at the National Guard Armory in Quincy.

The dinner will honor the former sheriff's memory and raise funds for an endowed scholarship in his name at Chipola College, where he served as student body president in 1962.

At the time of his retirement as Gadsden Sheriff last fall, Woodham was the dean of Florida law enforcement officials after having served in that position for 33 years. He

was well-known not just in his home county, but throughout the state, as a fair and compassionate man who could be tough when the occasion demanded.

Hosted by "100 Friends of W. A. Woodham" and sponsored by the Chipola Appreciation Club, the event will celebrate Woodham's life and contributions to the people of Gadsden County, while helping to endow a scholarship in his memory at the school that gave him his start.

The event will begin with a social hour at 6 p.m., followed by dinner at 7 p.m. Entertainment will begin at 8:00, featuring the world-famous Embers, the Raleigh, NC, band renowned for its exciting renditions of nostalgic "beach music" enjoyed throughout the years by Sheriff Woodham and his contemporaries.

Chipola seeks applications for EMT

Chipola College is now accepting applications for an upcoming Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) training program.

The EMT program prepares students for employment as ambulance drivers/ambulance attendants, or emergency medical technicians and to treat various medical/trauma conditions.

The curriculum includes simulated learning and clinical study. The 11 credit-hour course is 250 clock-hours in length. Cost is approximately \$1,000 for tuition, insurance, books and uniforms. EVOC (Emergency Vehicle Operation) is not included in the course. Clinical assignments are required in addition to regular class hours.

Application deadline is July 20. Candidate interviews are scheduled for July 26. Classes begin Aug. 2. The class will meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6 to 10 p.m. with some week-end classes.
