Jans named Chipola men's basketball coach



Chris Jans was named head men's basketball coach at Chipola Junior College on June 10. Jans will be introduced at a press conference Monday, June 16 at 10:30 a.m., in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center.

Jans replaces Ryan Cross who left last month to take an assistant coaching position at D-1 Louisiana Tech. Jans is Chipola's 13th mens' basketball coach. Chipola president Dr. Gene Prough said, "I am very excited to have coach Jans leading our program. He brings a wealth of college basketball experience and a successful background to Chipola."

Prough said Jans' decision to come to CJC was based on the community support he found at Chipola. "Chris spent a day in our community and he appreciates the great heritage of Chipola basketball that was established here by retired coach Milton H. Johnson," said Prough.

The 35 year-old Jans comes to Chipola from Howard College in Big Spring, TX, where he coached in 2002 and 2003. He led Howard to an overall record of 29-4 in 2003. The Hawk's finished the regular season with a national ranking of #15 after going to #2 earlier in the year. In 2002, Jans led the Hawks to an overall record of 20-10 and a conference record of 8-6.

Jans also has Division 1 experience. He was the top assistant at the University of Idaho (1999-2001) where he served two years under head coach David Farrar. He was head coach for one season (1999) at Independence Community College, guiding the Pirates to a 22-10 record and a 14-4 (2nd place) finish in the Kansas Jayhawk Eastern Division.

Jans' first head coaching position was at Kirkwood CC (Cedar Rapids, IA) in July of 1996. Inheriting a team that finished 11-20 the previous season, the Eagles more than doubled their wins finishing 25-10 and earning coach Jans the Region XI Coach of the

Year award. Kirkwood won both the conference and regional championship in addition to qualifying for the NJCAA Division II National Tournament, a first for the Kirkwood program.

In his second season at Kirkwood, Jans' team won the conference and regional championship and captured the 1998 NJCAA National Championship. Kirkwood finished the season 31-6. At age 28, Jans was named both Region XI Coach of the Year and NJCAA National Coach of the Year. Jans accumulated a 127-40 record as a head coach at Kirkwood, Independence and Howard.

Jans began his coaching career at Elmhurst College (Chicago, IL) in 1992. He was an assistant coach for two seasons before taking a similar position at NAIA Grand View College (Des Moines, IA) in 1994. Jans served two years at Grand View before receiving his first head coaching position at Kirkwood in 1996.

Jans played at Loras College (Dubuque, IA) from 1987-1991 and earned bachelors of art degrees in both Marketing and Finance. He was a three year starter and captained the team his senior year. Jans helped his team to a 47-25 record while breaking 16 scoring records and two NCAA records for three point shooting.

A native of Fairbank, IA, Jans graduated from Wapsie Valley High School in 1987. He was a five-sport letter winner, captaining his school's first state football championship and helping the basketball team to a 61-8 record.
