Student trainer scholarships available at Chipola

Chipola College will offer six Student Trainer scholarships in the Fall of 2004.

All students are welcome to apply. Preference will be given to individuals from Calhoun, Holmes, Jackson, Liberty and Washington counties interested in entering the allied health fields or certified trainer programs. Offspring of educators or allied health professionals are also preferred.

Applicants must have a 3.5 high school GPA and maintain a 2.8 college GPA. Student trainers will receive partial tuition and books.

Applicants must submit a Chipola Foundation scholarship

application to: C. David Farrar, Chipola College, 3094 Indian Circle, Marianna, FL, 32446. Two letters of recommendation must accompany the application. Applications must be postmarked on or before July 10.

Selected students must enroll in a first aid and safety course, and principles of prevention and care of athletic injuries during the Fall 2004 Semester. Trainers will serve under the direction of the Chipola Athletics Trainer. Trainers will have daily responsibilities similar to the expectations of student athletes on scholarship. Some weekend work and team travel will be necessary.
