CJC students enriched through Honors Program

The Chipola Junior College Honors program is helping students broaden their academic horizons.

Honor students schedule a weekly one-hour Honors Seminar in addition to their regular classes. This year's freshmen seminar, led by English instructor Warren Almand, is based on the Joseph Campbell film series entitled *The Power of Myth*. The sophomore seminar, led by math instructor Bonnie Smith, features guest speakers on a variety of topics. Students in both seminars prepare a presentation of the research project they conducted in their Honors course. Exceptional student presentations are often made to local civic organizations.

Acceptance into the program is competitive and requires a minimum high school GPA of 3.5 and an ACT score of 23. During the last decade, 335 graduates of high schools in Chipola's district have participated in the Honors Program. Program participants register in Honors courses in which instructors guide their learning be-

yond the regular scope of course requirements and assist them with special research projects.

Just a few of the perks that Honor students receive are preferred early registration, honors designation on transcripts and diplomas and most importantly, the opportunity to network with professionals and to gain a competitive edge for limited access programs and scholarships. Students who successfully complete both years of the Honors Program are invited to an end-of-the-program trip to New York sponsored in part by the CJC Foundation. This year's class will travel to Williamsburg, PA, in May.

Honors Program Chair Dr. Sarah Clemmons, who helped to revive the Honors program in 1989, says, "Our successful Honors Program has resulted from a cooperative effort by Chipola's outstanding faculty to provide additional academic experiences for students from our area."

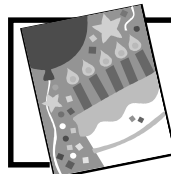
Ambassadors Leadship Conference slated for Tuesday

CJC Baseball/Softball Roundup

The Chipola Indians baseball team improved to 19-4 following a doubleheader sweep over Andrew College on Wednesday, March 6.

Chipola scored an 8-0 win in game one behind the pitching of TJ Large. Leading hitters were Clay Wehner, who hit two homeruns, and Eric Bernier who had a solo homer.

CJC won game two, 5-4. Troy Frye was the winning pitcher. Kellen Ludwig earned the save. Randy Roth blasted a three-run homer to put the Indians up 4-3. Trent Hebert's solo homer put CJC up 5-4.

The Indians play a string of home games beginning with Muscatine (DH), March 10 at 1 p.m. and Florissant Valley (DH), March 12 at 3 p.m.

The Indians begin their defense of the Panhandle Conference title on Friday, March 15 when

they host Tallahassee at 5 p.m. Chipola also has home conference matchups with North Florida, March 19, at 5 p.m.; Gulf Coast, March 23, at 1 p.m.; Pensacola, March 26, 5 p.m. and OW, March 29, at 5 p.m.

The Lady Indians softball team improved to 17-5 with a doubleheader sweep over Iowa Lakes Community College on March 6. Stephanie Gray (12-1) was the winning pitcher in both games.

The Lady Indians host San Jacinto, March 10 at 2 p.m. CJC begins conference play at Gulf, March 12 and at TCC, March 15. The team returns home to host North Florida, March 20 at 4 p.m.

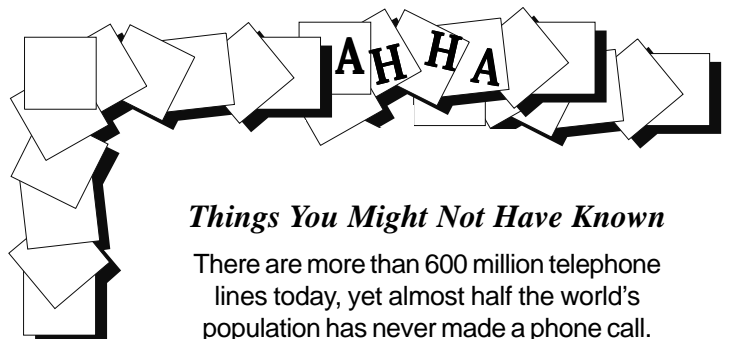
