State basketball tournament begins Wednesday at CJC

The **Lady Indians** play fifth ranked Miami-Dade in the first round of the state tournament, Wednesday, March 5 at 8 p.m.

Chipola is 17-13 overall with a 7-8 conference mark. Head coach Jason Keene, says, "The Chipola Lady Indians are a hard-working, close-knit team with good chemistry. They take pride in playing hard with tenacious defense."

Rebecca Montz leads Chipola's offense with 15.3 points per game. She is 83 percent from the free throw line and among the top three-point shooters in the state. Reginette Maddox is averaging 14.9 points and 1.6 assists per game. Lanita Carter leads Chipola in rebounds, averaging 7.1 per game. Heidi Fowler is averaging 6.3 rebounds a game.

Miami-Dade CC is the Southern Conference Champion, ranked fifth in the state with a 17-10 overall record. The Sharks are led by freshman point guard Maria Tobar who is averaging 11 points, 6 rebounds, 6 assists and 6 steals per game.

The **Indians** return to the state tournament after a five-year layoff to face Broward in the first round on Thursday at 6 p.m.

Chipola will be looking to avenge a 70-59 loss to Broward on Jan. 4. CJC head coach Ryan Cross said, "They're good. They beat us early, but it was before Nick Williams was full speed and Tom Frericks got hurt in the game. It's a game that we have a good

chance to win on our home floor."

Cross said his Indians are well-prepared for the big tournament. "I believe we've played the toughest schedule in the state. We scheduled some tough three-day tournaments with the intention of getting ready for this one. I think our guys will be really ready to play.

Chipola is led by Brandon Freeman who is averaging 20-plus points per game following a big 41-point performance in Chipola's final regular season game. He is second in the state in free throws at 85 percent. Michael Wilds leads the squad in rebounding with 8.4 per game. JueMichael Young is averaging 12.9 points per game. Tom Frericks is a solid inside player with a .587 field goal percentage and 6.1 rebounds per game. Walker Russell leads the state in assists with 9.8 per game, and 2 steals per contest. The Indians have outscored opponents, 79-67 on the year.

Broward CC is ranked third in the state and 18th in the nation with a 24-4 overall record and an 11-1 league mark. Nate Daniels leads Broward with 24 points, 8.4 rebounds, 2.4 steals a night. Cross said, "Nate is probably the best player in the state. The key is not to let the other players be a factor."

JueMichael Young will have the job of defending Daniels. Cross said, "JueMichael is fired up to play him."

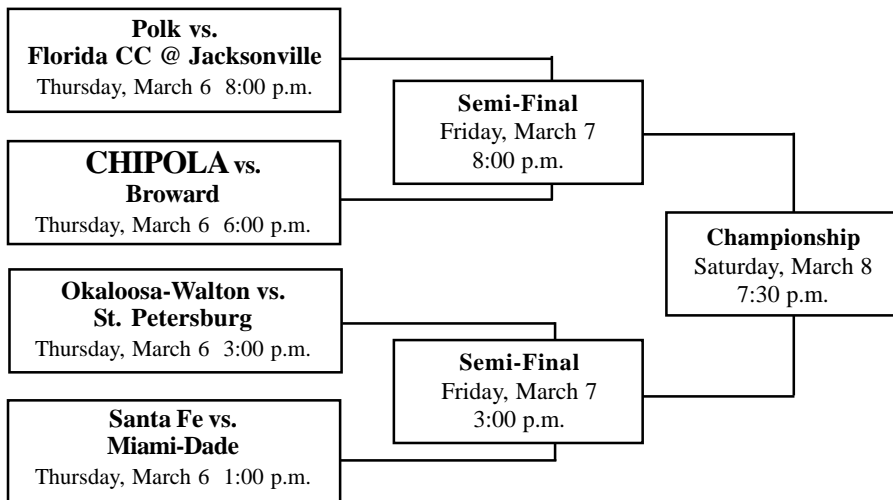

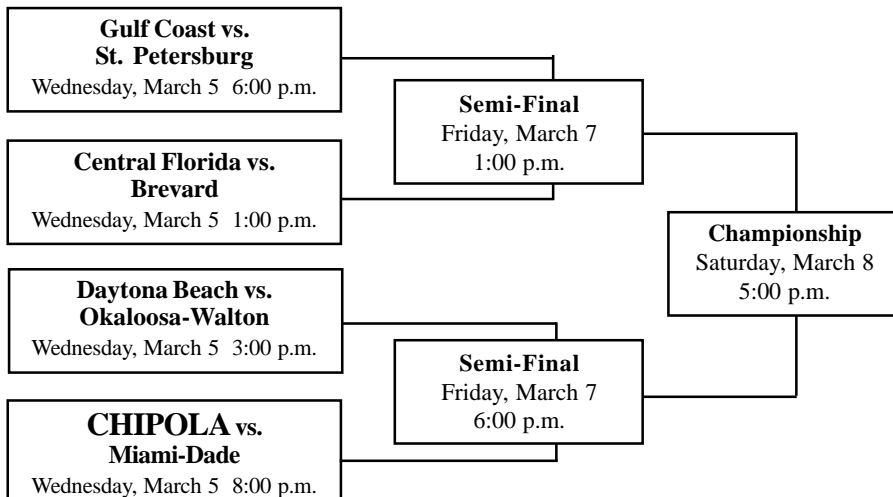

Chipola baseball and softball teams at home this week

The CJC Indians baseball team host a string of home games this week beginning with Grand Rapids, March 5 at 4 p.m.

CJC also hosts Pearl River, March 6 at 2 p.m.; Meridian, March 8 at 1 p.m.; and Meridian again on March 9 at 1 p.m.

Chipola is 7-3-1 following a 4-1 loss to Lake City Community College on Feb. 25. A Feb. 26 game with Wallace was rained out.

The Indians will be on the road this weekend at the Meridian Rush Classic Feb. 28, March 1 and 2. CJC will play Bishop State, Meridian and North East Texas. The Indians travel to Darton on March 4.

The Indians won three out of four games in the Fibercare Classic Feb. 21-23 in Marianna. Chipola whipped Louisburg 7-2. CJC scored an 8-0 win over Central Alabama. The Indians' only misfire of the classic came in a 4-3 loss to Miami-Dade. Chipola rounded out the classic with a 10-0 win over Middle Georgia on Feb. 23.

The Lady Indians softball team swept Jefferson Davis in a double header on Feb. 19 to improve to 11-2 on the year. Stephanie Hayes was the winning pitcher in Chipola's 9-0 win in game one. Hayes (6-1) had 11 strikeouts and gave up only one hit. Jessica Mathis earned the save. Leading hit-

ters in game one were Ashley Quick who was 2 for 3 and Leigh Savoy, who was 3 for 3 with a double and 3 RBI's.

Jessica Finch (2-1) earned the pitching win in game two. Amanda Edwards got the save. Leading hitters in game two were Heather Ebersole who was 2 for 4 with a double and Shirely Burleson who was 2 for 3.

The Lady Indians travel to Georgia Perimeter on Feb. 28, to Andrew College on March 1 and to Jeff Davis on March 3.

Chipola's next home softball game is March 9, against ICC, at 1 and 3 p.m.

Chipola hoopsters named All Conference

A dozen Chipola basketball players were recently selected for All-Panhandle Conference honors.

Brandon Freeman, JueMichael Young and Tom Frericks were named to the Men's All Conference Team. Michael Wilds, Walker Russell and Nick Williams earned Honorable Mention All-Conference honors. Russell also was named to the All-Freshman Team.

Freeman is averaging 20-plus points per game including a big 41-point performance in Chipola's final regular season game. He is second in the state in free throws at 85 percent. Wilds leads the squad in rebounding with 8.4 per game. Young is

averaging 12.9 points per game. Frericks has a .587 field goal percentage and 6.1 rebounds per game. Russell leads the state in assists with 9.8 per game, and 2 steals per contest.
