

More Chipola graduates attending state universities

According to a recent report from the Florida Community College System, the number of Chipola College graduates who enroll in senior institutions is up in recent years.

The Articulation Report showed that 503 former Chipola students were enrolled in Florida universities in 2002, compared to only 402 in 1999. More than half of Chipola's Associate in Arts degree graduates who continue at a university enroll in Florida State University. The percentage of Chipola students transferring to FSU ranged from over 60% in 2000 to just over 50% in 2002. Most other Chipola transfer students attend the University of West Florida, the University of Florida, and Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University.

Of the 503 former Chipola students enrolled in Florida's state universities in 2002, 255 chose FSU, 130 enrolled at UWF, 61 attended UF and 39 attended FAMU.

The most dramatic change has been the increase in the num-

ber transferring to UWF, to which only 46 or 11 percent had transferred in 1999, compared to 130 or 25 percent in 2002. UWF offers a number of bachelor's and advanced degree programs on the Chipola campus.



Chipola president Dr. Gene Prough said, "The impact of Chipola's University Center on campus has greatly increased the access to Bachelor's degrees for students in our area." Chipola recently expanded its own programs to include B.S. degrees in Secondary Education with majors in Math and Science. The first class of Chipola's four-year programs will graduate next summer.

The report also showed that Chipola students outperform other community college graduates when they transfer to a university. The average GPA of Chipola graduates enrolled in state universities was 2.99 in 2002, compared to a 2.89 average for all Florida community college transfers. The average GPA of Chipola graduates increased from 2.83 in 1999 to 2.99 in 2002.

Dr. Jayne Roberts is the recipient of the Faculty/Administrator of the Year Award at Chipola College.

Roberts presently serves as Dean of Enrollment Services at the college. She has responsibility over registrar and admissions, testing, financial aid, and serves as the college's Equity Coordinator.

Roberts began her career at Chipola as secretary to the Office of Community Relations and has served as Student Activities Director. While serving as Compass Club Advisor in 1989, the Chipola chapter was named the top chapter in the nation. Roberts has also taught several courses at Chipola including orientation, Introduction to Psychology, Career & Life Planning, and Human Growth and Development. She currently serves on a number of college committees and chairs the Calendar Committee. She is active in FACC where she serves on the Executive Board and serves as co-chair of the audit committee. An avid Chipola sports fan, Jayne is an integral part of

the State JUCO Tournament, serving as chair of the Team Hosts committee.

After being hired at Chipola, Roberts completed her A.A. degree. She then went on to earn a B.S. from FSU, an M.S. from TSUD, and an Ed.D from FSU. While a working on her Doctorate, Jayne was a recipient of the Stickler Award and the Maurice Litton Scholarship from the Educational Leadership Department at FSU. She has received the Faculty/Administrator of the Month Award for December 2001 and March 2004. She holds the honor being the first repeat winner of this award.

Jayne is married to Mel Roberts, parks recreation director for Jackson County. The Roberts have three daughters—Heather, Heidi and Natalie—all graduates of Chipola and FSU, and four grandchildren. The family is active in the First Baptist Church of Marianna where Jayne serves on several committees and is a member of the Celebration Choir and Handbell Orchestra. She has taught Sunday School for the Children's department since 1993.

The award includes a plaque, reserved parking for a year, a \$1,000 bonus, and a \$100 gift certificate from the College Book Store. The annual award is selected from among monthly winners.
