Chipola students named Academic All Americans

Chipola College sophomores Joni Goodman and Kimberly Rogers, both of Blountstown, have been named Academic All-Americans. The students were recognized at a press conference at the college, Monday, April 26.

The students will be featured in the April 26 edition of *USA Today*. Chipola English instructor Jody Spooner who serves as adviser to the campus chapter of Phi Theta Kappa says the pair of students has given more than 2,000 hours of time to community and campus projects. Each college can nominate only two students for the All-American team. "To have two students from the college named Academic All-Americans is tremendous. When you consider that Joni and Kimberly are ranked in the top 60 students out of the 11 million community college students in the country, the magnitude of the honor is even more impressive," Spooner said.

The All-USA Two-Year College Academic Team is open to associate degree-seeking community college students in the USA and its territories. The program is administered by Phi Theta Kappa, the international honor society for two-year colleges.



The Chipola sophomores also were named first-team members of the All-Florida Academic Team. Both students have been active in the Chipola chapter of Phi Theta Kappa. The pair helped

last year's PTK chapter earn the 2003 Most Distinguished Chapter Award, as well as top awards in the Hallmarks of Fellowship, Scholarship, Leadership and Service.

This year, Chipola's PTK earned the Scholarship Hallmark Award, Fellowship Hallmark Award, Beta Alpha Continued Excellence Award, Pinnacle Continued Excellence Award, and the *USA Today* Case Study Challenge Award at the 2004 convention.

Joni Goodman of Blountstown was named a member of Academic All American Second Team.

Earlier this Spring, she was selected a Guistwhite Scholar by Phi Theta Kappa. She is one of only 15 students to be chosen from nearly 700 applicants for this honor. The Guistwhite Scholarship Program annually awards 15 scholarships of \$5,000 each based on

Chipola College will hold registration for the Summer I term, Friday, May 7, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Classes begin Monday, May 10. Late registration continues through noon on May 11.

Application deadline for Summer Session II classes is June 10. Registration is June 22. Classes begin June 23. Graduating seniors who enroll in Summer II classes earn the right to register early for Fall classes.

Chipola's open-door policy guarantees acceptance to any student with a high school diploma. Prospective students should complete an application—available in the Registration Office—and provide an official high school or college transcript.

Chipola offers day and evening college credit courses, as well as Independent study and online courses.

Children's summer programs at Chipola

Chipola College will offer summer programs for children of all ages this summer.

Swimming lessons will be offered for ages four and up. Lessons are based on a combination of nationally recognized methods. Sessions are scheduled: Session 1: May 25-June 3, Session 2: June 7-17, Session 3: June 21-July 1; and Session 4: July 12-July 23*. Class times are 9 a.m., 10 a.m. and 7:15 p.m. for Sessions 1-3. *Session 4 evening lessons will meet at 6:15 p.m. Sessions include eight 45-minute lessons. scholastic achievement and participation in Phi Theta Kappa.

Goodman is a Chipola Honors Program student, a Student Ambassador and is active in the local chapter of Phi Theta Kappa. She also was one of two Chipola students nominated for the All-Florida Academic Team.

As the 2002 salutatorian of Altha High School, Goodman was awarded the Chipola Valedictorian Scholarship. She earned the Florida Academic Top Scholar award, presented to the top student from each county in Florida. She also won the Robert C. Byrd Scholarship which is awarded to the top five applicants from the state of Florida.

Goodman serves as a student assistant in Chipola Literature and Language Division and as a volunteer student tutor in the Tech Center and English Writing lab. She works countless hours on service projects including: voter registration, American Cancer Society, Project Graduation and the Day in the Life program. She currently is Team Development chair for the Calhoun County Relay for Life.

She recently raised \$1,900 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society by completing the Walt Disney World Marathon with a Team in Training group from Chipola.

Goodman is the daughter of John and Dorcas Goodman of Blountstown. She plans to pursue a major in business and eventually go to law school.

Kimberly Rogers

Kimberly Rogers was selected for the Academic All American Third Team.

She was one of only ten students named a Phi Theta Kappa **Leader of Promise**. The award includes a \$500 toward the completion of her associate degree. She also was the winner of the local PTK Leader of Promise award.

Rogers serves as Scholarship Officer for Chipola's Nu Chi chapter of PTK, the international honor society of two-year colleges. She also is a Chipola Student Ambassador and is active in Student Government.

On April 16, Rogers was named an Honorable Mention winner in the Florida

College Student of the Year competition during a ceremony at the state Capitol in Tallahassee. *Florida Leader* magazine selected Rogers from among thousands of exceptional campus leaders in the 17th annual Florida College Student of the Year Awards program. The prestigious awards program recognizes students who support themselves financially through college, excel academically, and are involved in community service and political activism.

The 2002 Valedictorian of Blountstown High School, Rogers is attending Chipola on the Florida Bright Futures program and Coca-Cola Foundation and Chipola Valedictorian scholarships.

Rogers plans to major in microbiology. She hopes to study medicine and specialize in pediatrics. She has been accepted to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and is considering attending Duke University.

Rogers is the daughter of Harry and Sandy Rogers of Blountstown.

Chipola student presents musical math composition

Chipola College student Mitch Sims presented an original composition to the Chipola music/math faculty and students.

Sims, a trumpeter, has been a member of the Chipola family since 1999. He has been involved with the Jazz/Rock Ensemble, Chamber Chorus, Show Choir, and Theatre Department and currently is a composition student of Dr. Allen Molineux.

Sims's composition, "Viaggio Corto," involves six instruments: trumpet, french horn, euphonium, tuba, timpani, and piano. The composition can be defined as freely tonal written for chamber music ensembles. Along with his composition, Sims discussed Bessel Functions, the mathematical functions for the sound waves exiting the bell of an instrument.

Sims was the recent recipient of Chipola's Calculus III Award. He plans to transfer to Wagner College in Staten Island, NY to earn degrees in Arts Administration and in Applied Mathematics. While in New York, Sims will perform with Wagner's Faculty Brass Quintet and the Richmond County Orchestra.

Culbreth named Who's Who

Dr. Laurie Culbreth, an English instructor at Chipola College, has been nominated again to be honored in *Who's Who Among America's Teachers*. Only students recognized in *Who's Who Among American High School Students* or *The National Dean's List* may nominate teachers who have "made a difference" in the lives of their former students. In each edition of *Who's Who*, only 5% of our nation's teachers are honored and less than 2% are included in more than one edition. UCF TRANSFERS. The University of Central Florida has now become the second largest state universities. While the number of students applying for admission continues to increase, the resources provided to serve and educate students have not kept pace with the enrollment growth. UCF is being forced to slow enrollment growth on the Orlando Campus.

UCF will postpone the admission of transfer students to the Orlando Campus who plan to leave Chipola prior to completing their AA degree. In addition, students who have applied for the Fall term may be denied admission if they have not submitted proof of the AA by July 1, 2004.

Transfer students may be admitted to one of the regional campuses since enrollment is not yet being limited at those locations. Also, qualified students who are not provided admission to the Orlando Campus for the Fall term will be offered admission for the Spring semester.
