

## Chipola to present 'Tapestry of Music'

## Chipola wins South Florida Novice Tournament



The Chipola Brain Bowl Gold Team went undefeated to claim the championship at the University of South Florida Novice Fall Tournament on Nov. 1.

This is the second championship in a row for the Gold team after winning the Delta Burke Tournament last weekend. The USF Novice is limited to first and second-year college participants including those from four-year schools.

Chipola advanced to the six-team playoff round by finishing 9-0 in their initial ten-team bracket. In the final round Chipola survived a close match with Pasco-Hernando and won on the last question. Next, they faced another undefeated team the University of Florida. Chipola posted their best match of the year defeating UF (350-95). Chipola went on to win its next match against Valencia CC (215-175) and defeated St. Leo University (300-175) in the finals to claim the title.

## Chipola beats top-ranked Indian Hills

The second-ranked Chipola Indians knocked off number one Indian Hills 62-61 on Nov. 3.

Chipola led for nearly the entire second half and then held off a late Warrior charge to win 62-61 in an early-season battle of elite junior college teams. "This is a great victory for our program," said Chipola Coach Greg Heiar. "To go on the road and play the preseason number one team in the country and walk away with a win shows the character and heart of our kids."

Casey Mitchell led the Indians with 15 points. Malcolm Armstead and Torye Pelham each scored 13. Jeremy Jacob had 11 points and 11 rebounds.

The Indians scored an 87-69 win over Mineral Area College on Halloween night. Chipola suffered its first loss of the year Nov. 1, in a 78-71 loss to Three Rivers.

Mitchell led with 22 points. Darrell Williams had 15. Flowers had 11, 8 rebounds, and 6 assists. Jacob had 11 points and 8 rebounds. Darius Stowers was injured in the game.

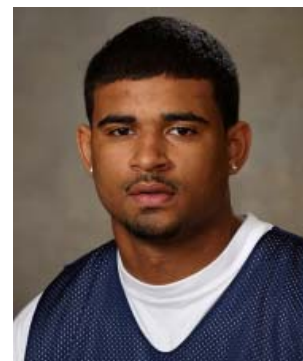
Armstead was in foul trouble early as the Indians played for most of the evening without a point guard on the floor. Pelham was in foul trouble all night as well.

Chipola (2-1) travels to Phenix City, AL, Nov. 7 to take on Chattahoochee Valley. The Indians face Atlanta Metro and Georgia Perimeter Nov. 14-15 in Decatur, GA.

The Indians host Cape Fear College in the first home game of the year Thursday, Nov. 20, at 7 p.m.

Chipola is the defending FCCAA state champion, ranked first in the FCCAA poll and second in the NJCAA poll.

## Lady Indians host Panhandle/Mid Florida Challenge

The Chipola Lady Indians open the home season this weekend in the Panhandle/Mid Florida Challenge.

The tournament kicks off at 3:30 p.m. Friday with the top ranked Lady Commodores from Gulf Coast against Santa Fe. The Chipola Lady Indians face FCCJ at 5:30 p.m.

Saturday's action begins at 2 p.m. with Gulf Coast and FCCJ. Chipola takes on Santa Fe at 4 p.m. The Lady Indians scored jamboree wins over FCCJ and Santa Fe earlier this year.

Chipola enters the classic at 2-0 after 53-30 and 69-66 over Indian River and Seminole last weekend. Carolyn Mills and Latoya Williams each scored 8 points in the Indian River game. Lenita Sanford led

Chipola with 20 points

and 12 rebounds in the Seminole game. Marnesha Hall had 10 points and 10 rebounds against Seminole. Ashlie Billingslea scored 18 with 6 assists.

Chipola is ranked second in the (FCCAA) Preseason Coaches' Poll behind top-ranked Gulf Coast. The poll includes: (1) Gulf Coast, (2) Chipola, (3) Santa Fe, (4) Pensacola, (5) Seminole, (6) Central Florida, (7) Tallahassee, (8) NW Florida (OW), (9) Daytona, and (10) Miami Dade.

Chipola hosts the Third Annual Alzheimer's Classic Nov.

13-15. Chipola coach David Lane, says, "This year's Classic will have no shortage of talented teams and players. The eight team field includes five teams who qualified for the National Tournament last year, including National Champion Gulf Coast. Throw in three more teams from the Panhandle—arguably the toughest conference in the country—and this year's Classic looks to be the best yet."

The three-day event will feature several Top Ten matchups. On Thursday, Nov. 13, a rematch from the National Tournament kicks off the evening at 5 p.m. as number two Trinity Valley (TX) takes on number 23 Georgia Perimeter. The nightcap will feature ninth-ranked Chipola against number 19 Monroe (NY).

Friday, Nov. 14, games begin at 1 p.m. Key matchups include defending National Champions Gulf Coast (number 5) versus number 19 Monroe (NY) at 3 p.m. The final game of the night will be between potential ninth-ranked Chipola and second ranked Trinity Valley.

The third and final day of the Classic should easily be the most entertaining. Games start at noon. At 2 p.m. Trinity Valley will be looking to avenge last year's loss to Gulf Coast. At 4 p.m., upstart Pensacola will look to make a splash against Monroe. The Classic's final game at 6 p.m. will be the most anticipated as ninth ranked Chipola meets top ranked Jefferson College (MO).

The games take on more intrigue as State Farm All-Americans Latoya Williams (Chipola) and Danielle Adams (Jefferson) battle to see who becomes the front runner for National Player of the Year.

Chipola averaged 304.4 points per game, holding their opponents to 95.6 points per game. Anthony Garrett led the balanced attack with 435 points (48.33ppg), finishing seventh in individual scoring among eligible players. Brad Wells also finished in the top ten, scoring 365 points (40.56 ppg). Ryan Wells (team captain) and Jordan Belser also had a strong tournament, scoring 220 and 75 points, respectively. Chipola was the only team in the tournament with two players in the top ten.

The Chipola Blue Team also had a strong showing, finishing

the tournament with a 5-4 record. The all freshmen Blue Team was led by Drew Padgett with 230 points, with Nathan Hooppell close behind scoring 190 points.

Chipola will play its last tournament this semester in the Academic Fall Tournament at the University of Florida next week-end.

## Spanish language study in Costa Rica

Chipola College will host a Spanish Language Travel Study program in Samara Beach, Costa Rica, during Spring Break, 2009. The total cost of the travel program is \$2489, if registered by Nov. 17. A deposit of \$495 is required by this date.

The price includes: meals, lodging, airfare, ground transportation, classes, tours, and excursions. The program is open to Chipola students enrolled for the Spring Semester 2009. No prior coursework or prerequisites are required. Students must have, or be eligible for, a valid U.S. Passport. Students will receive 3 semester hours credit for attending regular one hour per week classes on campus beginning Jan. 7, 2009 plus participate in an 8 day program of intensive language study in Samara Beach, Costa Rica during Spring Break, 2009. The dates for travel are March 29 through April 5, 2009.

The course, LAS 1950: Latin American Travel Study, is de-

signed to satisfy the multi-cultural diversity course requirement for graduation from Florida State University. The meeting time for the course is to be arranged.

In addition to intensive language study, students will live with a Costa Rican family. This will provide a total immersion experience with the language and culture. Students also receive instruction in cooking, Latin dance, and surfing. Following the 5-day study program, students will travel to Rincon de la Vieja Nacional Park where they will spend several days, exploring the park with its beautiful waterfalls and hot springs on horseback; taking a nocturnal canopy tour of the rainforest, and zip-line through the tree tops of the forest canopy.

## Cosmetology now accepting applications

The Chipola Cosmetology program is accepting applications Nov. 1-30 for the Spring semester which begins in January 2009.

The program will accept the first 15 qualified applicants.

Cosmetology is a competency-based, self-paced, open-entry program. A passing score on the TABE (Test of Adult Basic Education) is required with program entry.

Cosmetology is designed to prepare the student for employment as a licensed hairdresser and cosmetologist, registered nails or facial specialist, and to provide supplemental training for persons previously or currently employed in these occupations. The approximately one-year program prepares the student for successful completion of the state licensure examination which is required for the practice of cosmetology.

Program hours are weekdays from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. during the Fall and Spring semesters and Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. during the Summer I term.

## Chipola EMT and paramedic program

The Chipola College EMT and Paramedic programs are currently accepting applications for upcoming courses.

The next EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) program begins Jan. 12. Classes meet weekdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The next Paramedic program begins Jan. 12. Classes meet weekdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Acceptance is limited. Applicants with extenuating circumstances, such as military duty, may apply up to the day classes begin.

The EMT program is an 11 credit-hour course that is 260 hours in length. EVOC (Emergency Vehicle Operator Course) is included in the EMT curriculum. Clinical assignments are required in addition to regular class hours. Students must complete 20 hours of emergency room work in either Jackson ER and/or Northwest Florida Community Hospital) and 80 hours of ambulance ride time.

Prerequisites for the EMT Program include: high school diploma or GED and AHA healthcare provider CPR, FDLE background check and satisfactory score on the college placement test. The EMT program prepares students for employment as ambulance drivers/ambulance attendants, or emergency medical technicians and to treat various medical/trauma conditions.

Both EMT and Paramedic programs are intensive courses designed to prepare the student to function in both rural and urban environments. Both courses require high standards to prepare the student to function successfully in the diverse field of emergency medical services. For information, contact Keith D.
