Board renews president's contract

The Chipola College District Board of Trustees renewed the contract of college president Dr. Gene Prough during the board's regular monthly meeting, Nov. 16.

The president was granted a five-year rolling contract and given approval to enter the state Deferred Retirement Option Program (DROP). The action extends Prough's contract through November of 2010. Prough also was awarded a four percent raise, the same percentage increase provided for career, professional and administrative employees earlier this year. Trustees gave Prough an outstanding performance evaluation at the October meeting.

Following the meeting, Prough said, "I'm very proud to serve as president of this college. There are many good things that I hope to accomplish for our students in the coming years."

Prough was named Chipola's ninth president in October of 2002 and is the first Chipola alumnus named to the post. He served as Executive Vice president of Chipola from 1997 to 2002. Prough came to Chipola as Director of Vocational Education in 1994. He served as director of Washington-Holmes Area Vocational Technical Center in Chipley for 21 years.

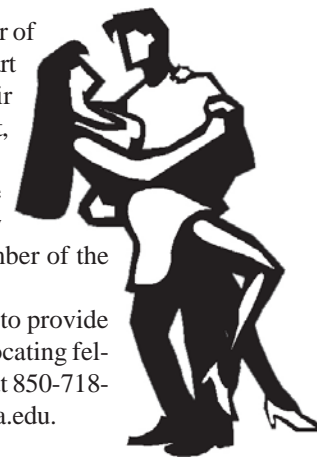
Chipola seeking former Show Choir members for Reunion

Former Chipola players performing well at next level

Several former players from the 2003-2004 Chipola College basketball program are performing well at the next level.

Je'Kel Foster (Ohio State University) scored 19 points in an exhibition game. Foster dropped 19 points on Northern Kentucky. Foster went 6 for 8 from the floor and 6 for 6 from the line. Along with his 19 points, Foster added four steals in 35 minutes of play, helping his team to a 77-67 victory. In his first regular season game against Towson, Nov. 15 in Columbus, Foster put up nine points, shooting 3 of 7 from the field including 2 of 4 from three point range.

Ohio State head coach Thad Matta said, "He comes in and will compete every day. He is a winner - he won 32 games in junior college last season. He knows what it takes."

Mario Jointer scored 19 points in his first game at the University of South Alabama. He also pulled six rebounds, and logged three steals. Jointer's contribution helped the Jaguars rout the University of North Alabama by a score of 90-58. Jointer will be in Tallahassee Dec. 16 when the Jaguars take on FSU at the Leon County Civic Center.

Vas'shun Newborne started in his first two games at the University of St. Louis. He is averaging 28 minutes per game. In his first game as a Biliken against Missouri-St. Louis, Newborne finished with 14 points and three blocks, shooting 7 of 14 from the field. The Bilikens defeated Missouri-St. Louis 67-60. In game two Newborne lead the team with 14 points, two blocks, and eight rebounds in a huge 70-48 win over Truman State. Newborne shot an impressive 6 of 10 from the field and 2 of 3 from the line in just 25 minutes of play.

Deke Thompson helped lead Southwest Missouri State University to a pair of exhibition game wins. In game one, he notched nine points, five assists, and three rebounds in an SMS rout of St. Gregory by a score of 88-52. In game two Thompson finished with four points, three assists and two rebounds in 20 minutes of play as the Bears defeated

Missouri-St. Louis 93-62. Thompson is currently playing in the same conference as Illinois State, whose new assistant coach Chris Jans, coached Chipola's 2003-04 season.

Leon Woodstock will begin play for Troy University in the Paradise Jam at St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands.

Shawn Malloy got his feet wet in two exhibition games for at the University of New Orleans. In game one Malloy started at forward and helped his team to a huge 71-46 win over Loyola. Malloy finished the night with eight points, nine rebounds, and two assists in just 18 minutes of play. In game two Malloy got the start at center and simply exploded with 19 points and 13 rebounds, shooting 7-8 from the field and 5-9 from the line in a 74-62 win over Arkansas Tech.

Kyron Monette has helped Shorter College to a 2-1 start after winning their first two games of a tournament at Berry College before losing #12 Southern Poly.

Several former Chipola Women's players also are making their mark at the four-year level.

Reggie Maddox made her presence known at Clemson University in the Lady Tigers only exhibition game of the season as she put up nine points and six assists, helping Clemson to a convincing win over Berry College by a score of 68-44.

Kristina Andjelkovic has played in a pair of exhibition games for the University of Arkansas. She scored two points and one rebound in 20 minutes of play in a 62-57 loss to Athletes in Action.

Melissa Killings will begin her four year career at the State University of West Georgia Nov. 16 against Georgia College. West Georgia is predicted to finish second in their conference, the Gulf South Conference.

Andrea Martin begins her career with Nova Southeastern University (NCAA Div. II) Nov. 19-20, in Valdosta, Georgia, as they take on Valdosta State and Lincoln Memorial. Nova Southeastern was recently named to the WBCA Academic Top 25 Honor Roll. They were the only Sunshine State Conference member to receive the honor.

The Chipola Indians host the Microtel Panhandle Classic, Dec. 3 and 4 in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center.

Conference fans will have the chance to see all five men's teams in action. Chipola hosts GA Perimeter in the 8 p.m. feature game on Friday, Dec. 3. Other teams are in action beginning at noon, Friday, with Gulf Coast vs. ABAC. Pensacola and South GA Tech play at 2 p.m. Okaloosa-Walton faces Santa Fe in the 4 p.m. game. Tallahassee takes on Middle GA at 6 p.m.

Chipola hosts Middle GA in the 8 p.m. game on Saturday, Dec. 4. Other games on Saturday include: Gulf Coast vs. Santa Fe at noon; Pensacola vs. ABAC at 2 p.m.; Okaloosa-Walton vs. GA Perimeter at 4 p.m. and Tallahassee vs. South GA Tech at 6 p.m.

The Indians improved to 6-1 with three straight wins in the Chipola Classic.

The Lady Indians improved to 6-0 with a 66-19 win over Delgado on Nov. 20. The Lady Indians host the Chipola Winter Showcase Dec. 16-18.

TAX TIP - SALES TAX DEDUCTION. Taxpayers who itemize deductions will have the choice of claiming a state and local tax deduction for either sales or income taxes on their 2004 and 2005 income tax returns. The State of Florida has no income tax, therefore, the residents of Florida will be able to take the sales tax deduction on their return. To determine the amount of sales tax that can be deducted the taxpayer may keep their receipts or take an amount outlined in tables provided by the Internal Revenue Service. The tables are optional but will allow the taxpayer to select the appropriate deduction based upon filing status, number of dependents, adjusted gross income and rates of state and local general sales taxation. Sales tax paid on motor vehicles and boats may be added to the table amount, but only up to the amount paid at the general sales tax rate.
