Artist Series presents Icarus “Manhattan Cabaret”

The Chipola College Artist Series will present “A Manhattan Cabaret,” by Icarus Musicworks of New York, Nov. 15, at 7 p.m. The performance originally scheduled for September was rescheduled due to Hurricane Ivan.

Described as a vivacious concert in cabaret form, A Manhattan Cabaret is a witty, intimate and engaging show of torch songs, ballads, rousing anthems, songs to warm the heart, lift the spirits and raise the roof. Selections from Rodgers and Hart, Gershwin, Gertrude Stein, William Balcom and more plus a generous helping of Broadway showstoppers as well as award-winning favorites from the theater, vintage and contemporary cabaret classics, jazz improvisation and a touch of grand concert hall magic.

Icarus Musicworks features bass baritone John Cimino, who delighted Chipola audiences last year with selections from Man of La Mancha and Porgy and Bess last season. Principal artists include Broadway and Cabaret soprano, Dianne Legro and percussionist Richard Albagli, a frequent guest performer at the Manhat-

tan School of Music and the Eastman Conservatory. Concert flutist Donna Wissinger makes a cameo appearance, and premier pianist Jon Klibonoff who has played mainstages worldwide rounds out the evening with classical virtuosity and Cabaret flair.

Two other big events are scheduled for the 2004-05 season. “A Trumpeter’s Dream” is set for Jan. 18, 2005. The Cashore Marionettes bring their internationally-acclaimed art of puppetry to the Chipola stage, Feb. 7, 2005.

The Artist Series is funded through Chipola’s Performing Arts Fund, with grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, the Chipola Regional Arts Association, corporate donors, and through ticket sales.

Individual tickets—\$12 for adults and \$8 for ages 18 and under—go on sale Nov. 8 in the college Business Office. Tickets for the annual Christmas Dinners also go on sale Nov. 8.

Indians open season with a victory

The Chipola Indians opened the season with a 100-69 win over PyExpress on Nov. 2.

Chipola had six players in double figures. Victor Gomez led with 17 points and seven rebounds. Mario Boggan added 15 points. Gerrard Jackson had 14 points and six rebounds. Ryne Hamblet scored 12. Stephan Hannah and Anderson Ferreira each scored 11. Ferreira led the team in rebounding with 12 grabs.

The Chipola men's and women's basketball teams were scheduled to host a big weekend of hoops action, Friday, Nov. 5, and Saturday, Nov. 6, in the annual Milton H. Johnson Classic.

The Lady Indians were set to play Middle Georgia at 5 p.m. on Friday, Nov 5, followed by the Indians against Shelton State at 7 p.m. The Saturday, Nov. 6 games were to begin at 4 p.m. with the Lady Indians facing Clinton College. The Indians were scheduled to play South Georgia Tech

at 6 p.m., Saturday.

The Indians travel to Gulf Coast for a tournament on Nov. 12 and 13. Chipola plays Fourcorners at 5 p.m., Nov. 12 and Beville State at 1 p.m., Nov. 13.

The Indians host the Chipola Classic, Nov. 18-20. Chipola plays CMI, Nov. 18 at 7:30 p.m.; St. John's River, Nov. 19 at 7:30 p.m. and Enterprise State, Nov. 20 at 7:30 p.m.

The Indians are the defending State Champions and Panhandle Conference Champions coming off an outstanding 32-5 season that ended with a sixth place finish at the national tournament.

The Lady Indians begin their second season under the direction of head coach David Lane who led his team to the quarterfinals of the state tournament last year to finish with a 22-9 record.
