Chipola to offer four courses online

Chipola Junior College will offer four courses online during the Spring 2002 Semester.

Dr. Laurie Culbreth, a CJC English instructor who also teaches online courses for the University of Phoenix, will offer ENC 1102 (Communications Skills II).

Dr. Lou Cleveland, an awarded CJC mathematics instructor, will offer EME 2040 (Introduction to Educational Technology) which is designed to prepare future teachers to use technology in the classroom.

Computer instructor Vikki Milton will offer CGS 1100 (Microcomputer Applications) and Gina McAllister will offer CGS 1060 (Introduction to Microcomputer Use).

Students in these courses will interact with instructors via

the Internet, meeting occasionally to complete in-class assignments. A chat room, CD-ROM and e-mail will be used to communicate with the instructor.

Online students should possess computer/internet skills and should be able to manage effectively their academic and personal schedules.

New students may register for Spring classes on Jan. 3 after completing the application process.

The Chipola chapter of Phi Theta Kappa hosted the event to promote leadership among high school sophomores and juniors from each of 16 area high schools in

the CJC district.

Jody Spooner, faculty adviser to PTK, said, "This event is designed to help encourage and nurture leadership in our area youth in order that they may better serve their schools and communities."

Phi Theta Kappa's International President, James Daugherty, presented a key-

note address advocating Youth in Leadership. Students joined in leadership exercises led by some 45 Chipola students. Activities focused on raising awareness of health issues in local communities and organizing events to address these problems in their schools and communities.

Chipola hoops squads open home season

The Indians entered the season ranked number two in the nation by *Street and Smith* basketball magazine. They opened the season with two wins in the OWCC Coca-Cola Classic Nov. 1 and 2. CJC scored a 97-55 victory over IMG Academy on Nov. 1. Six Indians scored in double figures led by JueMichael Young with 21. Michael Wilds chipped in 20 points and 14 rebounds. Brandon Freeman (19), Justin Smith (11), Nick Williams (10), and Shawn Simpson (10) also scored in double figures.

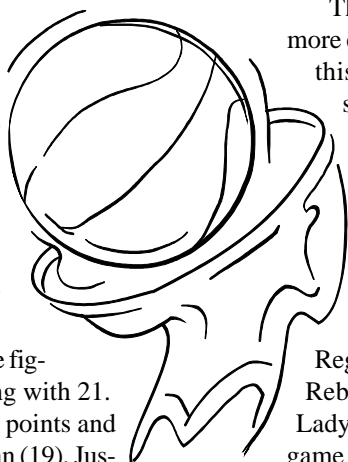
On Saturday, Nov. 2, the Indians battled through foul trouble to beat Bevil State, 78-62. Three Indians scored in double

figures led by Brandon Freeman with 23. Jue Michael Young scored 17 and Michael Wilds added 10 points and 12 rebounds.

The Lady Indians squad has more experience, talent and depth this year. They opened their season at a Columbia State Tournament in Tennessee on Nov. 1 and 2. CJC suffered an 80-69 loss at the hands of nationally-ranked Walter State CC. on Nov. 1. Leading scorers for CJC were

Reginette Maddox with 20 and Rebecca Montz with 16. The Lady Indians lost a close 70-67 game to Columbia State CC on Nov. 2. Leading CJC scorers were Reginette Maddox and Heidi Fowler with 15 apiece. Fowler also led the team with 8 rebounds.
