Chipola employees outline strategies for success

Chipola Junior College faculty, staff and administrators participated recently in a planning workshop to help develop a strategy for Chipola's success over the next 10 years. The session was facilitated by Dr. Barbara Jones, retired Director of Institutional Research and Planning at Northeast Mississippi Community College.

Jones assists colleges in planning and resource development and is a frequent speaker in workshops across the South. She praised Chipola's facilities, technology, and committed personnel.

Participants focused on future plans for three specific areas of the college: Academic Programs, Institutional Management, and Fiscal Stability. Strengths and weaknesses were identified and prioritized in each area. Included in the vision for the college were

three areas of concern. The first was a need for a Center for Teaching and Learning that would offer staff development for instructors to teach them how to use the technologies available to them today in the classroom, specifically training them for online course presentation. This center would also help facilitate other types of alternative and flexible scheduling, and offer student services such as supplemental instruction or tutoring services. Second was the need to set aside funds for new and existing program development, specifically in the math and science fundamental core curriculum leading into Chipola's new Baccalaureate degree in math or science education. And finally, a Career and Placement Center is needed to provide career information and placement services for students. The group also discussed the development of new marketing and

Chipola to offer courses online

Chipola Junior College will offer ENC 1101 (Communications Skills I) and EME 2040 (Introduction to Educational Technology) in an online format this Spring.

Students and instructors will interact via the Internet, meeting occasionally to complete in-class assignments. A chat room, CD-ROM and e-mail will be used to communicate with the instructor.

Dr. Laurie Culbreth, a CJC English instructor who also teaches online for the University of Phoenix, will teach the English course. Culbreth says, "Online students must possess computer/internet skills and should be able to manage effectively their academic, personal, and/or professional schedules."

Dr. Lou Cleveland, an awarded CJC mathematics instructor, will teach the Educational Technology course which is designed to prepare future teachers to use technology in the classroom.

Current CJC students may register Nov. 4-7. New students may register on Jan. 3 after completing the application process.

He is a charter member of the Florida Community College Hall of Fame and a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame.

Chipola announces early registration for spring classes

Current Chipola Junior College students may register for the Spring semester November 4-7. Current students are those who are enrolled in the Fall 2002 Semester.

New student application deadline for Spring classes is Dec. 6. Returning student registration and new student testing is Jan. 2. New student registration is Jan. 3, with classes beginning Jan. 6.

Chipola offers hundreds of college credit courses during the day and evening, and also through independent study. The college offers the Associate in Arts (AA) degree that guarantees acceptance to Florida's 10 public universities. Chipola also offers several Associate in Science (AS) and Workforce Development programs that provide training for high wage jobs.

Chipola's University Center provides opportunities for students to pursue a number of bachelor's degree and advanced programs on the CJC campus. CJC will begin its own bachelor's degree in Secondary Education in the Fall of 2003.

Alabama and Georgia students receive tuition break

Alabama and Georgia students will enjoy a reduction in tuition at Chipola Junior College beginning Spring 2003.

The CJC Board of Trustees recently approved a measure to charge students from the two states only one dollar extra per credit hour for college tuition and 90 cents extra for workforce fees. Current Chipola Junior College students may register for the Spring semester November 4-7. Current students are those who were enrolled in Fall 2002.

New student application deadline for Spring classes is Dec. 6. Returning student registration and new student testing is Jan. 2. New student registration is Jan. 3, with classes beginning Jan. 6.

Florida's high out-of-state tuition—more than triple the in-state rate—has prevented nearby out-of-state students from considering Chipola in the past. CJC's current tuition for Florida residents is \$52.50 per semester hour. Out-of-state students have been charged \$162 per hour. With the change, Alabama and Georgia residents will now pay \$53.50 per semester hour. Students who want to take advantage of the

savings will be required to complete a residency affidavit, available in the Admissions and Registration Office, prior to registering for classes.

Chipola president Dr. Dale O'Daniel said, "This new fee is really intended to help students from counties on the Florida border who may actually have a shorter drive to Chipola than to a college in their own state."

The president indicated that the new fee structure does have the potential to positively affect enrollment in public service programs like fire-fighting, corrections and law enforcement which may not be available in all areas of Alabama and Georgia.

O'Daniel said the college also would experience some savings on athletes' tuition. Some 10 CJC student-athletes are from Alabama and Georgia.

All community colleges with districts bordering on another state were given the option of reducing out-of-state fees. Chipola, Florida Community College at Jacksonville, Lake City, North Florida, Okaloosa-Walton, Pensacola and Tallahassee community colleges are affected by the change.
