

## Lane named Chipola Women's Basketball Coach

David Lane was named interim, head women's basketball coach at Chipola College on Monday, Oct. 13.

The 26 year-old Lane comes to Chipola from Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Springs, IA, where he served as an assistant coach in the men's program during the 2003 season. Kirkwood finished 19-0 in the NJCAA Division II, Region XI and third in the national tournament.

Coach Lane was a head coach for three seasons in the Prime Time/Game Time League, a summer league for men and women with collegiate experience. He also has college and high school coaching and organizational experience in a number of leagues and programs. He was the founder of the Iowa City Thunder Basketball Club, a league for middle school boys and girls. Lane was the organizer, coach and chief fund-raiser for the 14-team league.

Coach Lane said, "I'm excited about the opportunity that Dr.

Prough has given me. I'm anxious to meet the team and get our season started. I've heard a lot of great things about the school and the town and all of the great support for the school. Hopefully, we can achieve some success here."

Lane says his first order of business is to finish scheduling and begin teaching the players. The new coach will hit the ground running. The Lady Indians' first scrimmage was set for last Friday.

Chipola president Dr. Gene Prough said, "Coach Lane is the right man for the time. He has youth, energy and enthusiasm on his side. He has coached young women and men in high school and college and he has proven experience in recruiting, coaching and helping students-athletes succeed in the classroom."

A native of Iowa City, IA, Lane played baseball at Coe College in Cedar Rapids, IA. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History.

## Chipola's Ballyhoo opens Thursday

The Chipola College production of "The Last Night of Ballyhoo" opens a four-day run, Thursday, Oct. 23, at 7:30 p.m., in the college Theater. The comedy also plays Friday and Saturday at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday at 2 p.m.
