The Chipola Artist Series brings Branson, Missouri to Marianna when "Red, Hot ... & Blue," Branson's newest phenomenon, plays the Chipola College Theater, **Nov. 6 at 7 p.m.** Tickets are on sale now in the college Business Office.

"Red, Hot ... & Blue" takes audiences on a musical journey from Ragtime to the Roaring 20's, from the Classic Jazz of the 1930's to the Swingin' 40's and Big Band Era, and from the Hilarious 50's to the Rockin' 60's and Disco 70's.

"Red, Hot...& Blue!" has consistently been awarded Best Show and Best Vocal & Dance Group and the "hardest working cast in Branson." Six professional Broadway caliber entertainers sing and dance their hearts out in this high-energy, beautifully costumed and choreographed show. The cast of "Red, Hot...& Blue!" has performed worldwide with Holland-America and Prin-



cess Cruise Lines. The cast plays Branson, the live entertainment capital of the world, six months out of the year. "Red, Hot...& Blue" is a family show for babies to baby boomers and beyond.
