Corrections courses set

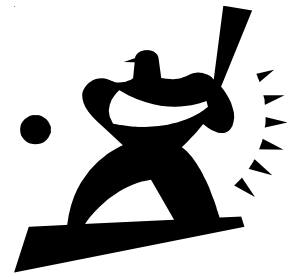
Chipola College's next daytime course in Basic Corrections begins Sept. 3. The course will meet weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
