Chipola to host High School Baseball Showcase

Chipola College Baseball will host its Fourth annual High School Showcase, Saturday, Sept. 17, at the Chipola field.

The event is open to all high school juniors or seniors who are current members of a varsity baseball team.

Chipola head coach Jeff Johnson says, "This is a great opportunity for players to showcase their skills and to gain national exposure while being evaluated by JUCO and Division I coaches, as well as professional scouts." Johnson says he is expecting from 50 to 100 pro and college scouts to attend.

Check-in opens at 8 a.m. on Sept. 17. The event will continue rain or shine with indoor facilities available. Skill evaluation for

running, hitting and fielding begins at 9 a.m. Skill evaluation for pitching and catching begins at 12:30 p.m. Players should wear baseball pants and bring their own bats, spikes, gloves, hats, protective cups etc.

Registration deadline is Friday, Sept. 9. Participants must provide proof of insurance and sign a waiver of liability. Cost is \$85. Chipola College is located in Marianna, Florida, 70 miles west of Tallahassee and 30 minutes South of Dothan, Alabama.

"All My Sons" explores the dangers of unprincipled greed, the limits of family loyalty and the importance of taking responsibility.

A limited number of individual event tickets—\$12 for adults and \$8 for ages 18 and under—will be available prior to each performance at the Chipola Business Office.

The Artist Series is funded through Chipola’s Performing Arts Fund, with grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, the Chipola Regional Arts Association and corporate donors.

“Heroes’ Journey” is a multi-session program designed and presented by internationally-recognized flutist and athlete Donna Wissinger who uses music, drama, athletics, and art to create a learning environment that is full of fun while building character, life skills, and civic responsibility.

Nancy Finch is the WINGS Program Director with the Panhandle Area Educational Consortium (PAEC) in Chipley. WINGS is a state and federally-funded 21st Century Community Learning Center Project for middle schools in Jackson, Holmes and Washington Counties.

Chipola workforce programs have openings

Registration is ongoing for a number of Workforce Development programs at Chipola College.

Most certificate programs feature open enrollment, which allows students to enroll at any time and complete programs at their own pace. All programs offer excellent job placement potential. Financial aid is available and remedial assistance is provided for most programs. Several programs have reached enrollment capacity, but have established waiting lists. Certificate Programs include: Applied Welding Technology, Automotive Service Technology, Correctional Officer, Computer Systems Technology, Electronics Technology, Cosmetology, Law Enforcement, Combination Law Enforcement & Corrections and Telecommunications.

Workforce preparation programs of study based on college credit courses include Associate in Science degrees, Associate in Applied Science degrees, and college credit certificates. Most courses in these programs require enrollment and attendance following the standard academic calendar (Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters). Apply now for next semester.

Associate in Science Degree Programs include: Business Administration & Management, Computer Engineering Technology, Computer Information Administration, Criminal Justice Technology, Culinary Management, Dental Hygiene, Early Childhood Education, Electronic Engineering Technology, Fire Science Technology, Network Administration, Recreation Technology, Telecommunications Technology and Office Administration.

Associate in Applied Science programs in Electronic Engineering Technology and Telecommunications Engineering Technology also are available. College credit certificates are provided in Dental Assisting, Child Development Early Intervention, Office Support, Office Specialist and Office Management.

 **MEAL PLANS AVAILABLE.** The Chipola College Cafeteria now offers Meal Plans.

A monthly breakfast card, good for 20 meals is \$4 per meal or \$80 per month. Lunch cards good for 20 meals are \$5 per meal or \$100 per month. Cards may be purchased at the Chipola business office.

 **PARKING REMINDER.** White and unpainted spots are for students. Green parking spots are for Chipola employees. Red designates fire lanes and blue is for disabled persons. Parking fines are \$20 and up. Students are required to display parking decals. Failure to pay fines will result in a hold on registration and student records.

 **HANDICAP PARKING.** New handicap parking permits are available in the Office for Students with Disabilities in Building G, Room 109. The new permit is to be displayed on the rearview mirror. Only students with the special permit will be allowed to park in handicapped parking on campus. If you have a documented disability, whether or not you currently possess a college handicap sticker, you should pick up your permit right away. Students parked in the handicapped parking spaces without the proper permit will be ticketed.
