Artist Series opens with “The Hot Club of San Francisco”

The Chipola Artist Series opens with **“The Hot Club of San Francisco,”** Tuesday, **Oct. 12.**

The hands of time will be turned back to the 1930’s and the small smoky clubs, refined lounges, and fancy hotel ballrooms of Paris. Hot Club is an ensemble of versatile musicians celebrating the music of Django Reinhardt and Stephane Grappelli’s pioneering Hot Club de France.

The ensemble borrows the all-string instrumentation of violin, bass and guitars from the original Hot Club, but breathes new life into the music with innovative arrangements of classic tunes and original compositions from the group’s superb lead guitarist Paul Mehling. Hearing the ensemble live, or on any of their seven albums, carries the listener back to the 1930’s and the jazz clubs of Paris and the lounges of the Hotel Ritz. Often called Gypsy Jazz, the music of Hot Club has entranced audiences around the globe for over 10 years. Critics have hailed the group’s playing as “intricate, scorching and often brilliant.” From festivals in Mexico and France to concert halls across North America, Hot Club of keeps this historic music fresh and alive.

Three other big events are scheduled for the 2004-05 season. **“A Manhattan Cabaret,”** by **Icarus Musicworks of New York** will play the Chipola Theater, Nov. 15. The show was rescheduled from its original Sept. 14 date due to hurricane Ivan.

“A Trumpeter’s Dream” is set for **Jan. 18, 2005.** Trumpeter Ron Romm and pianist Avis Romm enthrall audiences with selections from Chamber Music, Opera, Orchestra and Musical Theater.

The Cashore Marionettes bring their internationally-acclaimed art of puppetry to the Chipola stage, Feb. 7, 2005. The program is a series of touching portrayals and poignant scenes from everyday life set to a succession of stunning classical music. The show is recommended for adults and children age 8 and older.



The Chipola Artist Series is funded through Chipola’s Performing Arts Fund, with grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, the Chipola Regional Arts Association, corporate donors, and through ticket sales.

Season tickets—\$40 for all four events—are on sale in the college Business Office located in Building L. Individual event tickets are \$12 for adults and \$8 for ages 18 and under.

said, “Coach Heiar has an excellent record and proven experience in recruiting, coaching and helping students-athletes succeed in the classroom.”

Before coming to Chipola, Heiar spent four seasons as an assistant at Loras College (Iowa). He served as the recruiting coordinator and specialized in team defense and individual improvement. He also was an assistant coach at Franciscan University (Ohio) in 1999-2000.

Heiar’s successful playing career began at Dubuque Wahlert High School (Iowa) where he was a 2nd team all-state selection. At Kirkwood Community College (Iowa), he earned 2nd Team All-Region honors after leading his team to the National Tournament for the first time in school his-

tory. Heiar helped his team to a conference championship and a 25-10 record. He also was captain of Chris Jans’ first team at Kirkwood.

Success followed Heiar to Franciscan University where he was twice named team captain and “MVP”. He also earned numerous all-tournament honors, 1st Team All-Conference and led his club to the MCC conference title as a senior.

Coach Heiar said, “I’m thankful for the opportunity to coach this team. Chipola is a fine institution with great traditions. We will work extremely hard to continue those traditions.”

Heiar and his wife Jessica have a two-year old daughter Alexis.

Chipola College is preparing to offer a 600-hour, two semester, part-time program in Industrial Pipefitting.

Chipola Dean of Workforce Development programs, Bud Riviere, says the program is expected to begin in January 2005.

The planned sequence of instruction will focus on broad, transferable skills associated with pipefitting and will demonstrate elements of the Pipefitting Trades industry.

Upon completion of the first 300 hours of instruction, students may be certified as an Industrial Pipefitter Helper 1. Students may be certified as an Industrial Pipefitter upon completion of the second 300 hours.

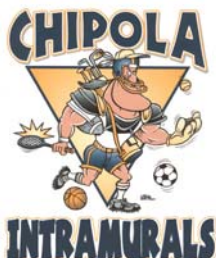
