## Chipola Baseball team leads conference

The CJC Indians baseball team is in sole possession of first place in the conference after a 16-11 win over North Florida in Madison on April 11.

**Ivan Naccarata** went 5 for 7 with a pair of three-run homers in the last two innings. **Philip Slusher** and **Russell Martin** also hit homers. **Jonathan Swearingen** was 3 for 4 with a double. **Blake Balkcom** and **Ricardo Nanita** were both 2 for 5.

**Chad Coffee** was the winning pitcher with one strikeout and one unearned run in 2 2/3 innings.

With the win, Chipola pulled a game ahead of second place Okaloosa-Walton 10-6. The Indians are ranked fourth in the state, with an 11-5 conference record and 35-12 overall.

The Indians beat Tallahassee 4-0 on April 8. Chipola had four runs on eight hits with no errors. The game was scoreless going into the eighth, before **Slusher**

singled. **Scott Wearne** doubled behind him putting runners on second and third. **Swearingen** singled to score **Slusher**. **Naccarata** doubled to score **Wearne**. **Jose Bautista** knocked in **Swearingen** and **Naccarata**. Leading hitters were: **Swearingen**, 2 for 4 and **Wearne**, 2 for 3. Winning pitcher **Kyle Olson** upped his record to 7-0. He struck out seven in seven innings, allowing only two hits, no runs, and two walks.

The Indians are in the home stretch of the season with only four games left: Gulf Coast at home, Friday, April 13 at 5 p.m.; at Gulf Coast, Saturday, April 14 at 1 p.m.; Okaloosa-Walton at home, Tuesday, April 17 at 5 p.m.; and at OW, Wednesday, April 18 at 5 p.m. The top two teams in the league advance to the state tournament.

## Chipola's Bruner named USA Today 1st Team All-American



CJC sophomore Andrea Bruner has received national attention in recent weeks.

Bruner's notoriety began in March when she was named to the First Team All-Florida Academic Team. She also was selected as a 2001 Centennial Scholar—the highest-scoring student from Florida in the All-

USA Academic Team competition.

She is president of the CJC Phi Theta Kappa organization that captured three national honors at the recent national Phi Theta Kappa meeting in Denver. She was one of 25 presidents tapped for a Distinguished Chapter President Award from among 500 chapters.

Bruner received a standing ovation for her keynote address at the 2001 All-Florida Academic Team State Board of Community Colleges' annual awards ceremony at the FSU Turnbull Center on April 3. Rod Risley, Executive Director of Phi Theta Kappa International, presented the 2001 Centennial Award, a \$2,000 Scholarship to Bruner, who was Florida's top team member.

On April 5, Bruner represented the state of Florida at the American Association of Community

Colleges Meeting in Chicago. That same day, **Bruner was featured in the USA Today newspaper** along with 20 other top community college students in the country.

At a press conference at Chipola on April 6, CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel offered statistics to show the importance of her honor. "Andrea is the very best of Florida's 370,000 community college students. And she was named in the top 20 of the 10.4 million community college students in the entire country. She is truly rare." Bruner thanked her parents and teachers for their support. "I really wanted to go somewhere more challenging, or so I thought, but it (Chipola) has turned out to be very challenging," says Bruner, 20, who is grateful now for the personal attention she has received at Chipola.

Bruner is the daughter of Sally and John Bruner of Chipley. A 1999 valedictorian of Chipley High School, she is a Florida Academic Scholar and a Florida Top Scholar. She is president of Phi Theta Kappa, and is active in Science Club, Mu Alpha Theta, and the CJC Honors Program.

She plans to attend the University of Florida, to pursue a major in Microbiology. Her plans include medical school and a specialization in obstetrics.

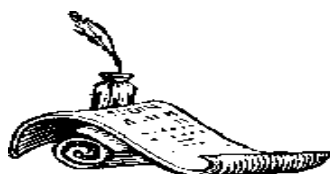

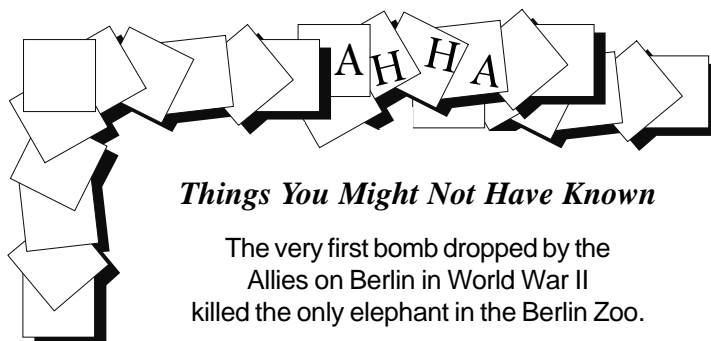
