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## Indians win Conference championship

The Chipola Indians baseball team captured the Panhandle Conference Championship with a 5-3 win over Okaloosa-Walton April 18 in Niceville.

With the scored tied at 3-3 in the top of the ninth, Ivan Naccarata hit a two-run homer to give Chipola the 5-3 edge. Russell Martin was 2 for 5 on the day. Jose Bautista had one hit, one stolen base, one RBI and two runs scored. Jonathan Swearingen and Josh Plaice each had singles in the game.

Chipola's three pitchers gave up only two hits on the day. Kyle Pawelczk threw the first three innings. Kyle Olson pitched 4 2/3 innings. Jose Bautista picked up the win, striking out three in the final 1 2/3 innings.

Chipola will meet the runner-up of the Suncoast Conference at the State Tournament in Kissimmee, May 9. OW

will play in the tournament as the Panhandle runner-up.

The Indians roster includes some of the top players in the state. Bautista is fourth in homeruns with 13, and twelfth in

runs scored with 48. He is also seventh in pitching saves with 5. Ricardo Nanita's .405 batting average is the fifth best in the state. He also is third in doubles with 17.

Naccarata is batting .358, including eight homers and 45 runs scored. Swearingen is hitting .352 and Poteet is at .337. Balkcom is ninth in triples with 4.

Kyle Olson is number 12 in pitching with a 7-

1 record. Sam Taulli is among the top 25 pitchers in the state.

The Indians finished the regular season ranked third in the state with a 13-7 league record, and 37-14 overall.

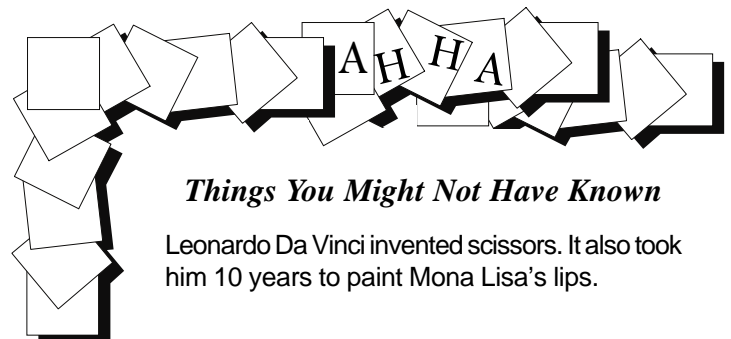
